I interviewed Dr. Petros Levounis, President of the American Psychiatric Association. Americans are open to having candid conversations with loved ones about substance use disorders and addictions. A new poll from the American Psychiatric Association found most Americans are familiar with treatment options. They were most likely to suggest in-patient treatment or support groups like Alcoholics Anonymous. Experts say medications and cognitive behavioral therapy can also be effective. He talked about how U.S. adults are ready and willing to talk to loved ones about substance use, the affects of substance abuse on younger adults, and how most Americans think substance use should be treated.

CRETE LOOKING AT GOLF CARTS

I shared that Crete officials are looking at the possibility of allowing golf carts on village streets. An ordinance has been drafted to permit golf carts there, but Police Chief Scott Pieritz said during a village board meeting that it would need additional research before he would endorse it.

“I am working with Trustee Phelan to gather information from other towns about them allowing operation of golf carts on public roadways,” he said. “I have public safety concerns on adopting this ordinance and want to get all the information (good and bad) from towns who already have allowed this to occur.”

Other area towns, including Peotone, do permit driving golf carts on certain streets, but have significant restrictions, including speed limits, registration with the state, and safety equipment.

Israel and Hamas October 2023 Conflict:

On October 7, 2023, the Palestinian Sunni Islamist group Hamas (a U.S.-designated foreign terrorist organization, or FTO) led surprise attacks against Israel from the Gaza Strip by land, sea, and air. The assault came on a Jewish holiday, 50 years after the Egypt-Syria surprise attack that sparked the 1973 Yom Kippur War. The attacks' scope and lethality against Israel have no precedent in the 16 years Hamas has controlled Gaza, and the nature of the violence stunned Israel. The apparent intelligence and operational failures in preventing the assault will be a subject of analysis for Israeli and U.S. officials. Iran reportedly provides material support to Hamas, and according to U.S. officials may be complicit in a broad sense, but President Biden has said "there is no evidence" that Iran helped plan the attack.

ALDERMANIC PREROGATIVE FUELS SEGREGATION AND VIOLATES BLACK, LATINO CHICAGOANS' CIVIL RIGHTS: FEDERAL OFFICIALS

I shared that the decades-old tradition of giving Chicago City council members the final authority over housing developments in their wards fuels segregation in Chicago and violates the civil rights of Black and Latino residents by limiting the creation of affordable housing, according to a letter from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Acting on a civil rights complaint filed in November 2018 against the city by the Chicago Area Fair Housing Alliance, a probe by the agency known as HUD found that aldermanic prerogative has created a hyper-segregated city rife with racism and gentrification.

This was also the first year women did not rank saving for retirement as their top financial goal, replaced by paying off credit card debt or saving for the unexpected.

I announced that Gary v. Glock is a 24-year-old lawsuit that refuses to die. Attorneys for Brady filed the lawsuit on behalf of the city of Gary, Indiana in 1999. At that time, more than 40 cities filed similar lawsuits, which sought to hold gun makers and gun dealers liable for murders that were committed using firearms. Some of the manufacturers named as defendants included Glock, Smith & Wesson, Colt, Sturm Ruger & Co., Beretta USA Cor. And Hi-Point. Various gun dealers – national and local – were also named in the city of Gary lawsuit. By 2006, almost all of these nuisance lawsuits were squashed – all except for Gary v. Glock. As a result, these dealers must now turn over their Acquisition & Distribution books to the government, which contain the names and addresses of hundreds of thousands of law-abiding gun purchasers.
