- Regarding capacity for indoor high risk activities such as restaurants, bars, and social establishments, indoor capacity is set at 50%, unless the county implements a policy requiring vaccination or a negative COVID-19 test result within 48 hours, in which case, there will be no capacity limits. This does include gyms, as well as bars, restaurants, and social establishments.

#### In December:

- COVID records soar as omicron spreads: The state Department of Health is reporting a COVID-19 count of 3,484 new cases today, surpassing the previous record for daily new cases of 2,205 reported on Sunday, Dec. 26. Today's count includes 334 cases on Maui, 242 on Hawai'i Island, 147 on Kaua'i, 21 on Moloka'i, one on Lāna'i, and 59 out of state, as the Omicron surge continues.
- Maui's plastic disposable foodware ban is postponed to March 1
- · CDC recommends shortened isolation and guarantine for COVID-19 infections
- Six individuals were arrested and charged during the state's Operation Keiki Shield 10 enforcement effort that was conducted between Friday and Sunday, Dec. 3-5, 2021 on Maui. All six are accused of first degree Electronic Enticement of a Child.
- Kona Low Storm results in multiple road closures, park closures, power outages, and flooding in Kihei and Kula. There's also an
  extended boil water advisory issued for portions of Upper Kula.
