Some 17 million americans will receive such a wage increase, from New York to California, although the increases would be implemented gradually throughout 2019. The measure would respond to policies related to cost-of-living adjustments, as well as to favor low-income workers.

The centers for disease control and prevention say that the illness particularly affects school-age children and reports at least 11 child deaths related to the illness. Health officials announce the official start of the 11-20 week flu season.
Salud	Despierta América	01/28/2019	0:30	Health officials in Washington have declared a state of emergency and are urging immunization as they scramble to contain a measles outbreak in two counties, while the number of cases of the potentially deadly virus continues to climb in a region with lower-than-normal vaccination rates. Washington Department of Health officials announced that as of Monday afternoon, there have been 36 confirmed cases and 11 suspected cases of the disease. That is a significant increase from the reported numbers on Friday, when Gov. Jay Inslee declared a state of emergency. At the time, there were 26 confirmed measles cases.
Economía	Despierta America	02/01/2019	0:30	Hiring began 2019 on a strong note as employers added 304,000 jobs in January, marking a 100th straight month of payroll growth and defying the 35-day government shutdown, the U.S. trade war with China and a slowing global economy. The milestone extended the labor market's record streak of job gains. The unemployment rate, which is calculated from a separate survey of households, rose to 4 percent from 3.9 percent, largely because of the government shutdown, the Labor Department said Friday. Economists

				surveyed by Bloomberg had estimated 165,000 jobs were added last month.
Economía	Despierta America	02/08/2019	0:30	Bankruptcy Court Judge Robert Drain approved the sale of most of the retailer's assets to a hedge fund controlled by Eddie Lampert, the company's chairman, for \$5.2 billion. The decision will keep 425 stores open and save the jobs of about 45,000 employees. In his decision Thursday afternoon, Drain rejected arguments from a committee of creditors, including landlords and major vendors, who had urged the court to shut the company down and liquidate the assets. The creditors, who are owed more than \$3 billion by Sears, argued that closing the company was the best way to return the most money. Those creditors will now have to wait to find out how much they get of the money they are owed, but it is likely to be pennies on the dollar in many cases.
Salud	Despierta America	02/11/2019	0:23	Recently, researchers from Columbia University Irving Medical Center found that exercise could help reduce the risk of developing Alzheimer's. Exercising releases the hormone irisin, which has been linked to neuron growth in the part of the brain responsible for memory and learning. Though irisin was linked to neuron growth in the hippocampus, the researchers first wanted to see if there was a relationship between the hormone and Alzheimer's. The findings showed that those who have Alzheimer's have lower levels of irisin. The researchers wanted to see how manipulating irisin would affect the brain, so they conducted a study with mice in which subjects were made to swim every day for five weeks. The mice also received injections of beta-amyloid a protein associated with Alzheimer's.

This is the surprising conclusion of a study, which questions the usefulness of sleeping long hours during the weekend. To make matters worse, experts point out that changing sleep schedules can alter metabolism and have serious long-term consequences.
Salud	Despierta America	03/27/2019	0:24	Scientists are getting closer to creating a hormone-based birth control mechanism for men, that would likely function and look much the same way as the pill that many women currently take. The pill, developed by researchers with the Los Angeles Biomedical Research Institute and the University of Washington, is a mixture of testosterone and progestin, and is designed to be taken once per day. Christina Wang, the lead researcher on the project, said that the team gave the pill to 30 healthy men between 18 and 50 years old for 28 consecutive days, while 10 other men were given a placebo. The goal was to test for safety and hormonal responses, more than the drug's actual ability to prevent pregnancy. The results showed only minor symptoms were felt: fatigue, acne, and headaches.
Salud	Despierta America	03/28/2019	2:00	The US Food and Drug Administration announced proposed changes to mammography standards Wednesday. These are the first changes to the regulation of mammography screening in more than 20 years, aimed at

				improving quality and modernizing breast cancer screening, FDA Commissioner Dr. Scott Gottlieb said. The key changes include providing patients with information about breast density, in the form of a letter, with screening results. Mammograms of dense breasts are known to be more difficult to read and interpret. "The dense tissue can obscure signs of breast cancer and lower the sensitivity of the image," according to the FDA. Dense breasts are also known to be a risk factor for breast cancer. More than half of women over age 40 have dense breasts, according to the FDA.
