They'll also double the number of weekly deals for Prime members, and will give those people an additional 10% off "hundreds of sale items" throughout the store. Prime members in dozens of metro areas can also get free Whole Foods grocery delivery if they spend more than \$35.

There were about 1.12 million visits to emergency departments for children ages 5 to 18 for either suicide attempts or suicidal thoughts in 2015. That was up from 580,000 in 2007, the study says. Among the disconcerting data, 43% of the visits were for young children - ages 5 to 11.

With 555 total cases, 2019 now has the second-highest number of measles cases in the United States in 25 years and the year isn't even half over. Measles isn't just rising in the United States. The World Health Organization reported

				Monday that there were more than 110,000 measles cases worldwide in the first three months of 2019, an increase of nearly 300% from the same period last year.
Salud	Despierta America	05/02/2019	0:29	California public health officials are warning moviegoers who went to see "Avengers: Endgame" and other films at an Orange County movie theater last Thursday that they may have been exposed to measles by a woman in the audience. The woman attended a midnight screening of the "Avengers" blockbuster at the AMC Dine-In Fullerton 20 on Thursday from 11 p.m. to 4 a.m, the Orange County Health Care Agency said. Everyone who was in the building may have been exposed, not just at that particular screening room, the agency said. The warning also applies to people who went to buildings at 5 Hutton Centre Drive in Santa Ana from last Wednesday through Friday.
Salud	Despierta America	05/13/2019	0:30	According to a study conducted by insurance company Netquote, new research shows that the average rideshare vehicle has about 219 times as many germs as the average taxi. Analysts also say these backseats are nearly three times dirtier than the average toothbrush holder and contain more than 35,000 times more germs than the average toilet seat. Most of the germs were reportedly found on the window buttons and seat belts. On average, researchers found more than 5 million colony-forming units per square inch on the tiny buttons and more than 1 million colony-forming units per square inch on the seat belts. The Netquote study examined three rideshare vehicles, three taxis and three rental cars.
