A mural which pays tribute to the City's 2020 Tricentennial will be unveiled and dedicated in downtown Opelousas on Saturday, September 2 at the Delta Grand Theatre—immediately following the Zydeco Breakfast and Children's Community Mural Painting. The unveiling is scheduled for 10:30 a.m.

Painted by eight local artists, the WELCOME TO OPELOUSAS mural depicts a retro postcard and features brightly colored letters.
