A fluent Arabic speaker and Muslim American, Tamer Elnoury helps protect the U.S. by pretending to be something contrary to all his personal and religious beliefs: a jihadi sympathizer.

Elnoury works undercover to gain the trust of active terrorist cells within the U.S., and then to bring them to justice.

Born in Egypt, Elnoury immigrated to the U.S. as a young child. He started his career in undercover narcotics, but reached out to the FBI after he was deeply affected by the 9/11 attacks. Though initially politely rebuffed, Elnoury was brought into the bureau a couple years later after a chance encounter with an agent. Elnoury's particular skill set of language fluency and undercover talents are a rare combination, and his ability to maintain his undercover legend –the persona he represents – is a crucial part of his job. **AMERICAN**

RADICAL illuminates Elnoury's life and career through one of his biggest cases that has recently been declassified: the 2013 Via Rail terrorism plot.

In the book, Elnoury divulges how he "bumped" (made contact with) Chiheb Esseghaier, a suspected terrorist living in North America, and then befriended him. Chiheb soon drew Elnoury into plans to blow up a train bridge on the Canadian-American border as well as a potential bombing in New York City's Times Square. Elnoury became so close with Chiheb that when the latter was finally arrested, it took several days of convincing before he finally accepted.

that Elnoury was FBI. A Muslim-American patriot, Elnoury is one of many heroes who operate undercover to protect lives and are seldom recognized. **AMERICAN RADICAL** provides the first real look into the perilous lives of these courageous men and women and the vital work they do to keep Americans safe.

luxury in Paris—until the Nazi occupation. Spaak joined the Resistance in Paris, and played an essential role in “kidnapping” hundreds of Jewish children to save them from deportation and the gas chambers. She then organized the infrastructure to maintain the children in hiding for the duration of the Occupation. In the final year of the Occupation, Suzanne was caught by the Gestapo, and was executed shortly before the liberation of Paris at just 39 years old. She is honored in Israel as one of the Righteous Among Nations, and yet until now, her story has been rarely told and she remains a relatively unknown figure of this moment in history.

· Never-before-told stories of the Resistance in Paris. There is no book in English that tells the story of Jewish resistance in Paris that Nelson’s book offers. Most of the survivors Nelson interviewed had never been interviewed before, and she can offer completely new stories about this little-discussed time in Paris’ history.

· A timely and cinematic story of heroism in the face of evil. Spaak’s daughter Pilette said one of her mother’s mantras was “*Il faut faire quelque chose*” (Something must be done). Nelson’s recounting of Spaak’s life offers a timely message of how in times of crisis, someone who dares to take action and do

something – who refuses to be a bystander – can truly make a difference. Although the records of the children rescued by Spaak's network were hidden and never found, the evidence suggests that all of the children survived the Occupation.

· Nelson's extensive research for the book. Nelson spent years conducting archival research and in-depth interviews. She extensively interviewed Suzanne's daughter, Pilette, who observed and participated in her mother's rescue operation as a teenager. She also interviewed other Parisians who assisted their parents in the rescue efforts. She spoke to now-grown children Suzanne rescued, many of whom had never been interviewed before. They provided Nelson with vivid first-person accounts of these little-known events in Paris' WWII history. Nelson recorded these interviews on video, and she also has photos to supplement an interview.

Anne Nelson is an award-winning author and educator. She is the author of *Suzanne's Children*; *Red Orchestra: The Story of the Berlin Underground and the Circle of Friends Who Resisted Hitler*; *Murder Under Two Flags: The US, Puerto Rico, and the Cerro Maravilla Cover-up*; and *The Guys: A Play*. Her work has appeared in *The New York Times*, *Los Angeles*

Times, Harper's, BBC, CBC, NPR, and PBS. Nelson is a recipient of the Livingston Award for International Reporting and a Guggenheim Fellowship. She is a graduate of Yale University and a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. She teaches at the Columbia School of International and Public Affairs in New York City.

At a time when some of our most powerful elected officials seem indifferent to the needs of America's most vulnerable citizens, Chris Matthews's *BOBBY KENNEDY: A Raging Spirit* serves as a timely reminder of what political leadership looks like. Matthews's new biography of Robert F. Kennedy portrays a politician with a moral conscience, the ability to bring people together, and a capacity to learn and grow as he championed causes that are as vital today as they were in the 1960s. "He stood for the desire to right wrongs that mattered then and which continue to matter every bit as much in the twenty-first century," Matthews writes. "He was, for so many, the one American leader of our lives who refused to turn his eyes from the people swept aside in our country's rush for economic prosperity and global prominence."

BOBBY KENNEDY marks the culmination of Matthews's personal

fascination with the Kennedy family, and serves as the perfect companion volume to his acclaimed bestselling biography of JFK, *Jack Kennedy: Elusive Hero*. "The younger brother's role was indispensable to history," Matthews writes, "getting his brother elected to the Senate and then the presidency; handling the Cuban Missile Crisis; and pushing the Civil Rights Act to the national forefront of the Kennedy agenda." But Bobby was not one to remain in JFK's shadow. "He was there at his brother's side, yet was always his own person, contributing and supporting but also taking charge and leading. No one who knew him was indifferent to him. No one who encountered him ever forgot him. In that, he was like his brother. His own path, however, led him elsewhere, into new places and new concerns that, most strikingly, became his heartfelt priority." "Recognizing the stubborn, burning passion that lay within him, I find myself now wanting to look into his life and understand both the origins and the evolution of that deepening commitment to a greater justice," Matthews says. "My goal here is to come to grips with his story, who and what he was and what lay beneath the man we saw."

Drawing on extensive research and intimate interviews, Matthews shines a light on all the important

moments in Bobby's life: his upbringing, his start in politics, his crucial role fighting for civil rights as attorney general, and his tragic run for president. A fellow Irish Catholic, Matthews illustrates how Bobby's faith and loyalty to family influenced him from his days as an altar boy to his years fighting for the rights of African Americans, Latinos, and Native Americans. RFK proved himself to be the rarest of politicians-both a pragmatist who knew how to get the job done and an unwavering idealist who could inspire millions.

freedoms that define us, from the vote to the press; the values that have transformed us, from empathy to inclusion to service; the institutions that sustain us, such as public education; and the traits that helped form our young country, such as the audacity to take on daunting challenges in science and medicine, Rather brings to bear his decades of experience on the frontlines of the world's biggest stories. As a living witness to historical change, he offers up an intimate view of history, tracing where we have been in order to help us chart a way forward and heal our bitter divisions.

With a fundamental sense of hope, *What Unites Us* is the book to inspire conversation and listening, and to remind us all how we are, finally, one.

With new insights, O'Donnell recounts an election where nothing went according to the script. The U.S. was in the midst of the Vietnam War, and a draft notice in the mail might potentially be a death sentence. President Lyndon Johnson seemed invincible against the likely GOP frontrunner Richard Nixon; that is, until out of nowhere, Eugene McCarthy shocked everyone and threw his hat in the ring to challenge his own party's incumbent. A revolution seemed to be taking place, and LBJ, humiliated and

bitter, began to look mortal. Then RFK leapt in, LBJ dropped out, and all hell broke loose. Two assassinations and a week of bloody riots in Chicago around the Democratic Convention later, and the old Democratic Party was a smoldering ruin.

PLAYING WITH FIRE tells the gripping story of 1968 election with a remarkable cast of characters, from the candidates themselves—**Nixon, Johnson, Kennedy, Ronald Reagan, Nelsen Rockefeller**—to the staffers whose fame has only grown in retrospect: **Henry Kissinger, Alan Greenspan, Pat Buchanan, a young Bill Clinton, and even Roger Ailes.** Out of the chaos of 1968, Nixon would emerge the winner by pulling off one of the greatest dirty tricks in American political history, an act that may well meet the statutory definition of treason. The only national fraternity founded in the antebellum South, Sigma Alpha Epsilon—a national organization with more than 15,000 undergraduate brothers spread over 230 chapters nationwide— is built upon the principles mandated in their creed, the creed of The True Gentlemen:
"The True Gentleman is the man whose conduct proceeds from good will and an acute sense of propriety, and whose self-control is equal to all emergencies; who does not make the poor man conscious of his poverty, the obscure man of his obscurity, or any man of his inferiority or deformity; who is humbled if necessity compels him to humble another; who does not flatter

wealth, cringe before power,
or boast of his own
possessions or
achievements; who speaks
with frankness but always
with sincerity and sympathy;

Memorized and recited by all
new members of the
fraternity, there is a wide
chasm between these high-
minded founding ideals and
the reality of SAE today.

These days SAE is widely
recognized on many
campuses by nicknames like
"Sexual Assault Expected."

The fraternity is also known
as the deadliest fraternity,
with 10 deaths mostly from
drinking and hazing reported
from 2005-2013 alone.

Universities have disciplined
more than 130 SAE chapters
over the past five years and
more than 30 chapters have
been shut down since 2013.

In recent years, racist
incidents at SAE chapters
have been making
headlines.

In 2006, two SAE students
were suspended at the
University of Memphis after
harassing another member
for dating a black woman
and bringing her to the
chapter's house. In 2009, the
Valdosta State University
chapter caused outrage on
campus after flying a
Confederate flag on its front

lawn. In 2013, the Washington University in St. Louis chapter of SAE was suspended after some of its pledges were instructed to direct racial slurs at a group of black students. In 2014, 15 SAE members at the University of Arizona broke into a historically Jewish off-campus fraternity and physically assaulted its members while yelling discriminatory comments at them. In 2015, the University of Oklahoma chapter horrified the world after video footage emerged of SAE members signing racist chants.

While SAE enrollment is still strong, it has been pilloried for what John Hechinger calls "the unholy trinity of fraternity life": racism, deadly drinking, and misogyny. Despite these problems and others, SAE remains a large institution with strong ties to Wall Street and unrivaled political reach.

John Hechinger – senior editor for Bloomberg News, two-time winner of the George Polk Award for his reporting on education, and 2011 Pulitzer Prize finalist – has gained unprecedented access to SAE as the only reporter with the cooperation of the national president of SAE. In *True Gentlemen*, Hechinger embarks on a deep investigation of fraternity culture, exposing the vast gulf between its founding ideals and the realities of its impact on colleges and the world at

large.

This book takes readers deep into SAE's history and politics as it examines the growing pressure on all fraternities to raise their seemingly invisible moral standards—or cease to exist entirely. Hechinger draws a fascinating and necessary portrait of an institution in deep need of reform, and makes a case for how it can happen.
