Issues and Programs 4th Quarter 2022 October 1, 2022 – December 31, 2022 *Stations:* KARS-FM

Section I – Issues

KARS-FM provides its listeners with programming that addresses issues of concern within the Northern Colorado community. The following issues were identified by this station as significant issues facing our community in the fourth quarter of 2022.

Community Involvement

According to the US Census Bureau, about 15 percent of the Fort Collins population is of color and 392 businesses are minority-owned in the area.

• Children's Health & Welfare

According to Safe Kids Worldwide, every 5 days a child is killed in a train collision and there are over 3,000 railroad crossings in Colorado.

Tobacco Free Colorado states that 27 percent of youth use e-cigarrettes and Poudre High School, located in Fort Collins, has the highest vaping rate in Colorado.

• Veterans:

According to the Census Bureau, 371,081 veterans live in Colorado and over a thousand are homeless and don't know how to receive help and adequate clothing.

• Poverty & Family Support

According to the City of Fort Collins and the US Census Bureau, there are currently 3,000 children in foster care and about 9.7 percent of families are suffering from poverty. Colorado School Districts report that over 23,000 students suffer homelessness.

Animal Welfare

According to the American Veterinary Medical Association, about 53 percent percent of Colorado households don't have any pets and the number of shelter pet adoptions are down 8.9 percent in Colorado.

• Public Health and Safety

The Colorado Central Cancer Registry, found that cancer is the leading cause of death in Colorado, killing more than 7,000 people each year. The Colorado Cancer Coalition states that 1 in 7 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer in their lifetime - risk is calculated up to age 85.

The Red Cross says that every 2 seconds, someone in the US needs blood and according to a recent blood drive, Larimer County's supply is waning.

According to the CDC, Colorado's second leading cause of death is heart disease.

• Poverty & Family Support

The Census Bureau states that 17 percent of people living in Fort Collins have below-poverty-level incomes.

• Persons with Disabilities

According to the CDC, 864,454 adults in Colorado have a disability.

• Family Abuse & Neglect

The Colorado Department of Human Services found that 1 in 4 women and 1 in 7 men experience sexual and physical violence in their lifetime, and 1 in 4 girls and 1 in 6 boys may experience sexual assault before the age of 18.
