MEDIA BUREAU ANNOUNCES EXTENSION OF TIME FOR ENTITIES TO FILE DOCUMENTS INTO THEIR ONLINE PUBLIC INSPECTION FILES

As a result of current technical issues adversely affecting the responsiveness of the Commission's Online Public Inspection File (OPIF) system, we extend the deadline by which all broadcast, cable, and satellite entities must upload required documents into their OPIF. All documents that were due to be placed in an entities OPIF since January 1, 2023, must be filed no later than January 31, 2023.¹ Extending OPIF filing deadlines will not significantly impact the public's or the Bureau's review of licensee's compliance with the Commission's rules. While we are extending OPIF filing deadlines, we encourage licensees to file all documents as soon as practicable.
