This documentary, "The Lost Homecoming. When Our Vietnam Veterans Came Home" is not about the Vietnam war. It is instead about the men and women who fought in the war and the shameful way some were treated when they returned home. While much has been said about the war,

relatively little has been said about the negative homecoming many Vietnam veterans experienced.

Veterans of WWI & WWII were met by crowds greeting them as returning heroes while Vietnam veterans were met by hostile crowds criticizing them for fighting a war in which a large segment of the American population saw an unjust and immoral war. Some turned against the war and misdirected their opposition to the war onto those who fought the war.

Harold Dawley, Jr. Ph.D. began developing this documentary approximately 40 years ago during his career as a Veterans Affairs psychologist. It was a time in which an increasing number of Vietnam veterans with mental and emotional problems were turning to the Veterans Affairs Medical System for help.
