Community

Topic: Mother's Against Murderers Association: "Crime Prevention in Communities"

This show highlights the issue of gang and gun violence in our community. Mother's Against Murderers Association spoke about how their organization assist grieving mothers who have lost children to violence. A package was included to show MAMA in action in our community and the efforts they are making to reach out to our youth. The organization assists in planning funerals, providing counseling and monetary support to families that have been affected by such violence.

This is show highlighted the services offered by these two companies. Greg Turner and Brian Henderson serve in the community as motivational speakers. Their focus is primarily on our youth and they provide services such as counseling, mentorship, career and educational development. Many of today's youth struggle with acceptance and peer pressure, Mr. Turner and Henderson have built their organization to combat these problems. They try to reach our at-risk youth and guide them on the path of success.

Rep. Taylor came on the show to speak about new laws passed, taxes, insurance, education and other issues that concern our local citizens. In the first segment she spoke about her current pursuit to increase the penalties of hate crimes and to have the homeless be protected under this law. She spoke financial reimbursements for a man who was wrongly accused and spent 24 years in prison. Rep. Taylor is representative of district 84;

which covers the Glades, Riviera Beach, Southern and Royal Palm. Rep. Taylor explained that in order for these laws and programs to be carried out efficiently, there would have to be adequate funding, which is the reasoning for such high taxes in our area at this time.

HEALTH SERVICES

These doctors came on the show to offer their services and to inform woman in our community of the dangers and remedies of uterine fibroids. They came onto the show to make everyone aware of this condition. The segment began with Dr. Suzanne explaining what fibroids are and the symptoms of this condition.

Topic: Planned Parenthood

Guests: Judith Selzer (VP of Public Affairs) and David Block (Task Force Leader)

Judith and David came on Around Our Town to discuss what makes Planned Parenthood the nation's number one trusted provider of health information and services, with specific emphasis on South Florida's Hispanic Community. Planned Parenthood has been in our community for years aiding our youth and adults with planning children. They also stress sexual safety issues, birth control and other health matters. Planned Parenthood has an open atmosphere in which anyone can walk in and ask for help about health. Their goals are to reduce teen pregnancy, decrease STD's, improve family communication, and enhance knowledge of reproductive healthcare. David Block explained that they are reaching out to the growing number of Hispanics in our communities by having bilinguals such as himself on staff. David stressed the importance of this as a means to make the Hispanics; particularly those who do not speak English, feel comfortable and more accessible to the resouces Planned Parenthood has to offer.

Topic: Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation: Ride 4 Kids

Guests: Rhonda Friedenberg (Task Force Leader), Debbie Coombs (Mother of brain tumor survivor), and Nicole Coombs (brain tumor survivor and scholarship recipient)

Guests came on show to speak about their annual ride for kids which benefits the Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation. This organization raises money to find a cure of brain tumors which is the number one killer of children other than accidents. Rhonda Friedenberg also spoke about how this annual event helps the public become more aware of the disease and how it is affecting our children and communities. The Ride 4 kids event is a great opportunity for the public to become involved. The Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation gives grants to the nation's leading medical institutions to assist in research and therapies for children who suffer from this disease and offer family support services. Nicole Coombs a brain tumor survivor was their most recent recipient of their scholarship which is given to students seeking higher education.
