Topic: Teen Temps, Inc.

Summary: Teen Temps, Inc. is a community-based, non-profit organization with a mission of providing future generations of youth with preparation and experiences through a "career opportunity system." Our focus is on delivering customized, motivating, and meaningful job placement or work experiences to underserved youth through the following key components: Provision of comprehensive counseling and guidance in occupation and career preparation; Provision of work-based and community-based learning to impart academic mastery and social skills competencies for a range of employment settings; and Placement in paid and unpaid apprenticeships, internships, externships and jobs leading to

formal credentials for "value-added" occupational and career choices.

The innovation of Teen Temps is that it is structured to operate with youth and young adults similarly to the way a temporary employment agency operates with its employee clientele providing placement and matching of employees with employers for long term advancement through permanent placement, apprenticeships, customized training and / or postsecondary education. Teen Temps will begin with efforts to attract and retain teens in grades 9 - 12 through participation in career exploration and identification as a component of its afterschool program.
