<u>FOCUS ON SOUTH FLORIDA</u> – A half-hour weekly public affairs broadcast featuring panel discussions and interviews with community leaders, focusing on important issues of local concern. Broadcast dates and times as indicated in the report.

PUBLIC SAFETY/CONSUMER RIGHTS: Topics in this category included: Hurricane Wilma, and a new post-hurricane Wilma housing program.

FOCUS ON SOUTH FLORIDA: 11/19, 7 AM. UPN33 Meteorologist Craig Setzer, Bruce Nissen of the FIU Center for Labor Research & Studies, and Michael Cannon of Integra Realty Resources discussed the aftermath of Hurricane Wilma and its effects on South Florida's economy. 12/17, 11 AM. Armando Fana, director of Miami's HUD program, discussed a new post-hurricane Wilma home lending program from the government.

FAMILY/EDUCATION: Topics in this category included: the debate over creation and evolution education in Florida's public schools.

<u>FOCUS ON SOUTH FLORIDA:</u> 10/18, 7 AM. Tom DeRosa of the Creation Studies Institute, Mion Rahman of the Center for Inquiry, and Michael Cannon of Integra Realty Resources discussed the debate over creation and evolution education in Florida's public schools.

GOVERNMENT/INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS: Topics in this category included: September 11<sup>th</sup>, the war in Iraq, and chemical trains.

<u>FOCUS ON SOUTH FLORIDA:</u> 12/03, 7 AM. UPN33 Investigative Reporter Mike Kirsch, Political Analyst and Columnist Paul Crespo, and Political Activist Jimmy Walter discussed the debate over the motives and future of the war on terror and homeland security concerns in South Florida regarding freight trains that, the government says, could be used as weapons of mass destruction.

CRIME: Topics of this category included: Reynaldo Rapalo's escape from jail and prison security.

<u>FOCUS ON SOUTH FLORIDA:</u> 12/31, 7 AM. Detective Delrish Moss of the City of Miami Police and Former Prison Guard Julio Anta discussed the accused Shenandoah rapist escape from jail and the future of prison security.
