The Welcome House is an interfaith agency which works to help homeless individuals and families obtain and sustain permanent housing. It fills a gap in our community by serving homeless who would do not qualify for services with other agencies, e.g., single fathers with dependent children and families with teenage males. On Saturday, August 18 three professions (medicine, law, and theology) will each be represented by a team of 8 athletes (the docs, the crocs and the frocks): 2 bikers, 2 runners, 2 swimmers and 2 walkers. Each athlete will perform an athletic challenge on behalf of their team. Bikers will bike 20 miles, runners will run 5 miles, swimmers will swim 1 mile, and walkers will walk 3 miles. Each athlete is challenged to collect a minimum of \$500 in donations for the Welcome House to support their athletic performance.
