One of the most unique structures in our town can be seen on South Church Street. Its an actual quoinset hut from the previous world war.

This unique building is almost a one-of-a-kind as far as being found in local communities. But here, it has served as a meeting place for veterans, a recreational center, and many other functions over the years.

In recent years, the building slipped into poor condition. But, realizing the uniqueness and historial significance of this rare structure, several loal citizens worked to revitalize the building.....giving it a "new lease on life".

Norm Osborne is one of those who has worked tirelessly to bring about a revitalization of the building and restore it to its rightful place in our small community.

Mr. Osborne, or our Focus public affairs program, gave a history of the building.....it's one time use as even a church (complete with pews) a library, and more recently a place where square dances were regularly held.....giving rise to teams that went on to compete in Nashville. The building for years also served as one of three voting precincts in the town of Livingston.

It's renovation and new lease on life was welcomed by the people of our town who value the building, its continued usefulness, and its great historical significance both locally, and in the war.
