Fire officials say having a working smoke detector in your home increases your chances of surviving a house fire. During the extreme cold the Fire Department sees an increase in home fires involving space heaters. The fire department is asking residents to test your smoke detectors and insure they operate properly. If you are using a space heater, maintain at least 48 inches of clearance around the heater and do not use extension</p>

Deborah Pearson also says if residents need relief from the cold, the Houston County EMA is offering a warming station starting at 4 this afternoon at the First Church of the Nazarene on Honeysuckle Road and will remain open until 8 tomorrow morning. Also in Enterprise, the Enterprise Recreation Center is open beginning today through noon Wednesday, located at 421 Lee Street for a warming station.</p>

Smith says the service is available up to the tax deadline date. The free income tax preparation services are available to working families making less than \$52,000 a year with children in the home or \$20,000 without children in the home. All you have to do is call for an appointment. The service takes the usual turnaround time for you to get any refund. Impact Alabama Save First initiative is in its 8th year of operation. Last year over 425 trained students from more than 16 campuses prepared tax returns for more than 6200 families statewide. To have your taxes prepared, call 1-888-99-tax.</p>
