This jihadist militant group based in the Middle East has made clear its intentions to terrorize, kill and destroy anyone who doesn't adhere to the tenets of Islamic fundamentalism. Christians remain a key target of this group ISIS. The widespread and vicious persecution of believers in Iraq and Syria, is a tragedy of staggering proportions. And we have even reported to you before our work in the

Middle East through our office in Cairo and what's being done there. Many people and leaders around the world—Christians and non-Christians, liberals and conservatives alike—are urging the U.S. State Department to classify ISIS's efforts to exterminate Christians in this part of the Middle East as genocide, which I know we would all agree with. The genocide declaration would help persecuted Christians in a host of ways, from increasing humanitarian aid, to enhancing their ability to receive asylum, to encouraging greater United Nations intervention. Congress has imposed a deadline of this coming Thursday for the State Department to decide. And I would ask you to please join me in praying first and foremost for our courageous brothers and sisters who are facing this kind of life-and-death persecution in Iraq and Syria. But I also want to ask you to let your voice heard on their behalf. You can start by visiting www.focusonthefamily.com/radio, where you'll find a link to my blog to give you ideas on what you can do. And I hope you will contact the State Department on behalf of our brothers and sisters. This is not something we can be silent about. Won't you do that? I pray so."
