Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community this quarter:

- A. Environmental Issues:** Community Gardens; Wintering Hummingbirds in our radio coverage area; Wetumpka's 85-Million-Year-Old Marine Impact Crater; How to Resuscitate a Garden.
- B. Societal, Arts and Health Issues:** Counterfeit Goods; Personal Finance; Portrait Quilts; Tom Woodward's Artistic Legacy; Social Security Update; Charles Neidich and the New York Woodwind Quintet; Wi-Fi Precautions from the Better Business Bureau; Serving the Needs of Rural Communities; Composer Aaron Copeland's American composition, *Billy the Kid*; Same Sex Marriage; Background Checks on People Selling Securities; the Great American Spit-Out and the Stop Smoking Campaign of ADPH; Improving Your Credit Score; People with Disabilities; Estate Planning; Arts Education in Public Schools; Retirement Planning; Measles and Vaccinations; Library of Congress National Library Service Talking Books Program; Taxpayer Identity Theft.
- C. Global Issues:** Nuclear Proliferation; the Middle East; Latin America.
- D. Historical Issues:** The Columbus, Georgia, Symphony, the Nation's Second Oldest Orchestra; Herbs of Yesteryear; the Martin Luther King Jr. Community Celebration 2015; Mill Towns and Mountain Heritage; the Wiregrass Archives; Rosa Parks' Nieces Remember Their Aunt; the George W. Bush Childhood Home; The Significance of Fairytales in Today's Cultures; the 213th Birthday of Victor Hugo; the Civil War; *Deep Rivers*, Composer Mohamed Fairuz and His Musical Bridge from the Civil War to Civil Rights; the Words of Individuals Who Participated in the Selma to Montgomery Voting Rights March in 1965; the History of Moonshine; the 19th Century Musical Contributions of Blind Tom Wiggins of Columbus, Georgia; the 1921 Murder of Catholic Priest Father James Coyle in Birmingham; the Early Juvenile Justice System in Alabama; African American Indians; Troy University Students at the Selma Bridge Crossing Re-enactment; Alabama's Historic Movie Theaters.

Section II: Responsive Programs.

The station has broadcast programming dealing with each of the above-referenced issues. Programming on *In Focus*, with host Carolyn Hutcheson, dealt with each issue in a 7-minute time frame, beginning at 12:08 PM Central time each day. Shorter interviews are 5 minutes in length.

A. Environmental Issues:

-Broadcast on February 3:

A discussion by phone with guest Michael Jackson, executive director of the DuBois Institute, about Aunt Katie's Community Garden in Dothan. Jackson, a master gardener, is using the garden to launch school gardens that train students on growing and eating healthy foods. The garden also serves as a neighborhood enterprise, since it is located in a low income area near downtown Dothan. Jackson serves on the State Obesity Task Force.

-Broadcast on February 10:

A 5-minute discussion with guest Fred Bassett, federally licensed master bird bander and founder of the nonprofit Hummingbird Research organization, about his latest findings of wintering hummingbirds in our coverage area. This winter Bassett has recorded fewer wintering hummingbird visits than in years past. He also talked about how our listeners have become citizen scientists over the past decade, by helping Fred with his scientific research on hummers found in their yards.

-Broadcast on March 2:

An on-location discussion at the Kelly Fitzpatrick Memorial Art Gallery at the City Administration Building in Wetumpka with guests Hope Brannon, curator, and Marilee Tankersley, chair of the upcoming tours of the Wetumpka Marine Impact Crater meteorite site of 85 million years ago. The gallery features paleo art depicting the creation of the five-mile-wide crater, which is studied by scientists around the world. Brannon talked about how the visual arts add a new perspective to our scientific knowledge of the crater.

-Broadcast on March 26:

A discussion by phone with Helen Sue Kemp, Wiregrass master gardener and Dothan Area Botanical Gardens board member, about how to resuscitate a garden. She talked about winter-to-spring gardening and shared a recipe for carrot soufflé.

B. Societal and Health Issues:

-Broadcast on January 12:

A 7-minute discussion with guest Brian Noyes, Executive Director of Strategy and Communications at the US Chamber of Commerce's Global Property Center (by phone from Washington, DC) about the proliferation of counterfeit goods worldwide. Noyes talked about the dangers of counterfeit goods, especially with prescription drugs sold online, and he gave advice to consumers on how to report suspected counterfeit goods to authorities.

-Broadcast on January 12:

A five-minute discussion with guest CPA Jessica Roberts with the Central Alabama Community Foundation about implementing New Year's financial resolutions.

-Broadcast on January 13:

A discussion with guest artist Riche' Richardson and Rosa Parks Museum curator Dan Neil, about the portrait quilts Richardson has been making since childhood. Her most famous portrait quilt, which hangs in the Troy University Rosa Parks Museum, is of the civil rights icon when she was booked and arrested in Montgomery,

-Broadcast on January 22:

A discussion with guests Katy Floyd, art historian, and Philip Preston, executive director of the East Alabama Arts Association, about the worldwide artistic legacy of Tom Woodward. As an art student, a car accident put Woodward in a wheelchair, but he continued to draw for the remainder of his life. An exhibition and sale of his work will raise scholarship funds for promising art students.

-Broadcast on January 26:

A 5-minute discussion with guest Kyle' McKinney, public affairs officer with the Social Security Administration, about changes to Social Security in 2015.

-Broadcast on January 26:

A 7-minute discussion by phone from New York with guest clarinetist Charles Neidich of the New York Woodwind Quintet, and in-studio with guests Mary Miles, board member of the Montgomery Chamber Music Organization, and Curtis Hollinger, principal clarinetist with the Montgomery Symphony Orchestra, about the technical and musical training of young musicians. The New York Woodwind Quintet will perform January 29 in Montgomery.

-Broadcast on February 2:

A 5-minute discussion with guests David Smitherman, president of the Better Business Bureau of Central and Southern Alabama, with precautions on using Wi-Fi, due to security issues.

-Broadcast on February 4:

A discussion with guest Ron Sparks, Director of Alabama's Rural Development Office, about the challenges of meeting the needs of the 57 rural counties in the state – expanding telemedicine and broadband, plus economic development.

-Broadcast on February 5:

A 5-minute discussion by Maestro Thomas Hinds, host of the Montgomery Symphony Radio Show, with guest Kitty Seale, artistic director of the Alabama Dance Theatre, about composer Aaron Copeland's *Billy the Kid*, and what musical elements make it distinctively American. A February 16th concert presents the composition.

-Broadcast on February 10:

A discussion with executive producer and reporter Kyle Gassiott about the same sex marriage issue in Alabama. On February 9, same sex marriage became legal in Alabama, and Gassiott was on hand at the Montgomery County Courthouse to cover the story.

-Broadcast on February 16:

A 5-minute discussion with guest Joseph Borg, director of the Alabama Securities Commission, about how to check out those who would sell you securities. The ASC can give investors information on whether sellers are licensed by the State of Alabama. Alabama has become a state with zero tolerance for securities fraud.

-Broadcast on February 19:

A discussion with guest Brett Stanfield, former smoker and youth tobacco prevention coordinator with the Alabama Department of Public Health, about the Great American Spit-Out and Threw with the Chew Day. Stanfield, who lost most of his family to tobacco-related cancers, talked about the hazards to young people of traditional cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, and questionable E-cigarettes.

-Broadcast on February 20:

A discussion with guest Wayne Curtis, former Alabama Superintendent of Banking and professor emeritus at Troy University, about ways to improve a credit score.

-Broadcast on February 24:

A discussion by phone with guest Mackenzie Westmoreland, award-winning New York playwright, filmmaker, and director, who became completely blind five years ago as part of the complications from diabetes. Now on dialysis, Westmoreland has used his blindness to heighten his senses as a writer. He will deliver the Helen Keller Lecture at his alma mater, Troy University, on March 3.

-Broadcast on March 2:

A discussion with guest Lynne Bozeman, Montgomery Certified Public Accountant, about ways to plan for what happens to your estate.

-Broadcast on March 4:

A discussion with guest Donna Russell, executive director of the Alabama Alliance for Arts Education, about statewide initiatives to strengthen arts education in the schools and provide funding to bring the arts back to the school curriculum. Arts training involves the exercise of creative thinking, which later transfers to innovation in the workforce.

-Broadcast on March 23:

A discussion with guest Wayne Curtis, former superintendent of banking for the state of Alabama and professor emeritus at Troy University, about retirement planning with a new tool – a retirement account from the US Treasury: myra.treasury.gov.

-Broadcast on March 25:

A discussion with Dr. Karen Landers, assistant state health officer for the Alabama Department of Public Health, about the re-emergence of measles and the subsequent dangers to those who can't be immunized. Now approaching an epidemic, vaccinations are more important than ever.

-Broadcast on March 30:

A discussion by phone with MaryBeth Wise, network consultant for the National Library Service of the Library of Congress, about the Talking Books program for people who are visually impaired. Thousands of books are available in digital format, with equipment provided free to blind and visually impaired patrons. Wise discussed the technological innovations that make Talking Books user-friendly. NLS has been serving the nation for 84 years with the Talking Books program.

-Broadcast on March 30:

A five-minute discussion with Montgomery CPA Lyvonnia Poppell about Taxpayer Identity Theft, a disturbing trend where criminals steal people's identities, file tax returns, and collect refunds from the government.

C. Global Issues:

-Broadcast on February 11:

A discussion by phone with guest Valerie Plame Wilson, author of *Fair Game*, who was outed as a CIA operative, and in-studio with Dr. James Nathan, Executive Director of the Alabama World Affairs Council, about Wilson's commitment to nuclear non-proliferation.

-Broadcast on March 22:

A discussion with guests David Greenlee, Troy University Ambassador-in-Residence, and Jonathan Harrington, Troy University political science professor and director of the Master of Science in International Relations program, about the political crises in the Middle East, as well as an assessment of the political climate in Central and South America. The ambassador also spoke to students about careers in foreign service.

-Broadcast on March 23:

A discussion by phone with guest Paul Chappell, a former Army captain deployed to Iraq and now a self-described soldier for peace. He said we need to adjust our expectations when dealing with ISIS, and as Peace Leadership Director for the Nuclear Age Peace Foundation, he has written a series of seven books outlining a path to world peace. Chappell, a native of north Alabama, is to deliver the Durr Lecture at Auburn Montgomery on March 29.

D. Historical Issues:

-Broadcast on January 14:

A discussion with guest Maestro George Del Gobbo, Conductor of the Columbus, GA, Symphony, about the orchestra's longevity as the second oldest orchestra in the US, and a few of the highlights of its history.

-Broadcast on January 14:

A 5-minute discussion with guest Debbie Boutelier, president of the Herb Society of America, about an herb cultivated by our forebears – the elderberry and its use during the winter cold season.

-Broadcast on January 19:

A discussion with guest Pastor Shirley Cobb, a member of the planning group of the Martin Luther King Jr. Community Celebration 2015 about the plans and events for the Keepers of the Dream organization.

-Broadcast on January 26:

A discussion with guest Faye Gibbons, who incorporates her north Georgia mill town heritage into her books for young adult readers. She talked about the mountain community, its customs, and her experiences growing up.

-Broadcast on January 28:

A discussion with professor Martin Olliff, director of the Wiregrass Archives, housed at the Troy University Dothan Campus, about the unusual stories behind some of the historical collections.

-Broadcast on February 5:

A discussion with guests Shirley McCauley and Shelia McCauley Keys, about their aunt, Rosa Parks, who raised them as her own children. The nieces discussed the aunt they knew and wrote about in the book, *Our Auntie Rosa*.

-Broadcast on February 16:

A tour of the George W. Bush childhood home and museum in Midland, Texas, with executive producer and reporter Kyle Gassiott.

-Broadcast on February 20:

A discussion by phone with guest Richard Scott Nokes, an English professor at Troy University and a specialist in medieval literature and folklore, about *Cinderella* and the relevance of fairytales today. A 5-minute followup discussion with guests from the Alabama Dance Theatre - artistic director Kitty Seale and choreographer Sara Sanford, about the translation of *Cinderella* to ballet, with the inclusion of her family backstory.

-Broadcast on February 25:

A discussion with Maestro Thomas Hinds, host of the Montgomery Symphony Radio Show, about writer Victor Hugo's influence on composers and musicians of his era. Tomorrow is the 213th anniversary of the birthday of Victor Hugo.

-Broadcast on February 26:

A discussion with guests Kendall Sirkis, producer of the Southeast Alabama Community Theatre's production of *Les Miserables*, and Eddie Farnham, director, about the impact the play has had on the cast.

-Broadcast on March 3:

A discussion by phone with guest Ed Ayers, the Nineteenth Century Guy on *Backstory*, the public radio program, about the Civil War and its interpretations. Ayers will lecture at Auburn University later today about "The Shape of the Civil War." Ayers is president of the University of Richmond and a history professor.

-Broadcast on March 4:

A discussion by phone with composer Mohamed Fairuz about his new work, *Deep Rivers*, which bridges the Civil War and Civil Rights, with musical influences from the Middle East. His composition will have its debut tomorrow in Montgomery, in commemoration of the Selma to Montgomery Voting Rights March.

-Broadcast on March 6:

A reading by guests Yvette Smedley-Jones, actress and performing arts program manager for the Alabama State Council on the Arts, and Greg Thornton, actor and artistic director of the Cloverdale Playhouse, of words written by individuals who took part in the Selma to Montgomery Voting Rights March of 1965. Excerpts from the production, *On the March*, being performed this evening at the playhouse.

-Broadcast on March 16:

A discussion by phone with guest Jaime Joyce, a journalist who researched the history of moonshine and discovered that women were also moonshiners and that George Washington made his own spirits, although he paid taxes on the brew. Her book is *Moonshine: A Cultural History of the America's Infamous Liquor*.

-Broadcast on March 16:

A discussion with guest Deb Boykin, Community Arts Program Manager for the Alabama State Council on the Arts, about the life and music of Blind Tom Wiggins, a 19th century musician from Columbus, Georgia. His unique talent took him from slavery to fame across the US.

-Broadcast on March 17 – St. Patrick's Day:

A discussion by phone with guest T.K. Thorne, retired Birmingham police captain and writer, about the murder of Catholic Priest Father James Coyle in 1921 by the father of the bride he married to a Puerto Rican groom. A separate discussion by phone with guest Jim Pinta, author of the book about Father Coyle, *Killed in the Line of Duty*. Thorne analyzed the case from a law enforcement perspective, while Pinta analyzed the case from an Irish Catholic discrimination perspective.

-Broadcast on March 18:

A discussion by phone with guest Jerry Armor, whose book, *Home for Wayward Boys: The Early History of the Alabama Boys' Industrial School*, recounts the story of reformer Elizabeth Johnston, who in 1900 led the movement to establish a separate rehabilitative facility for boys in Alabama. Previously, juveniles had been incarcerated with adult criminals. Armor is a former juvenile probation officer.

-Broadcast on March 19:

A discussion by phone from Bozeman, Montana, with University of Michigan professor of American Culture Tiya Miles, who uncovered the history of American Indians who owned slaves in the Southeast. Her visits to the Chief Vann House in north Georgia led to a reinterpretation of the historic site, and to her book, *The Cherokee Rose: A Novel of Ghosts and Gardens*.

-Broadcast on March 23:

A program hosted by producer David Caddell, who joined two busloads of Troy University students in Selma for the 50th anniversary re-enactment of the Bridge Crossing. Student interviews reflected their impressions of this historic event.

-Broadcast on March 24:

A discussion with guest Martin McCaffery, director of the Capri Independent Film Theatre, about Montgomery's historic movie houses, many of which have been torn down. He also talked about the African American movie houses, and the years when segregation meant movie balconies.
