Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community this quarter:

- A. Societal Issues:** Blindness and Vision Impairments, Cuba today, Health Recovery, Community Violence, Literacy Initiatives, Helen Keller's example to parents of children with disabilities, the War on Terror; Gloria Steinem and Women's Issues; Jewish Cultural Traditions from Europe; the Juvenile Justice System; the Alabama Virtual Library's Resources for Job Seekers; Chinese Language Instruction for Businesses; Multiple Sclerosis; The Sudan and South Sudan; Social Security Changes; Flood Insurance.

- B. Historical Issues:** America's National Parks, Traces of the Slave Trade, Eufaula Athenaeum; the Cultural Crossroads of Alabama 200 years ago with War between White Settlers and Creek Indians; Archaeology of the Wiregrass; Presidential Ties to the State of Georgia; The Voices of Alabama/Museum of Alabama; F. Scott and Zelda Fitzgerald; the Selma Voting Rights Campaign; the Tuskegee Veterans Administration Hospital; the National Civil War Naval Museum; African American Spirituals; The Monuments Men in World War II; the Bicentennial of the Battle of Horseshoe Bend and Living History Programs; the Conflicted Legacy of Andrew Jackson.

- C. Environmental Issues:** Montgomery Zoo and Global Species Preservation Projects; Severe Winter Weather and Hummingbirds in our coverage area.

Section II: Responsive Programs.

The station has broadcast programming dealing with each of the above-referenced issues. Programming on *Community Focus*, with host Carolyn Hutcheson, dealt with each issues in a 12-minute time frame, beginning at 12:10 p.m. Central time, each weekday.

A. Societal Issues:

-Broadcast on January 8:

A discussion with guests Durden Dean, Executive Director of Alabama Lions Sight Conservation Association, and Cindy Ducker, Lions Sight Board member, about eye care services offered at the new River Region Lions Eye Clinic at Health Services in Montgomery, providing eye care for indigent citizens in several counties.

-Broadcast on January 10:

A discussion with guest Dr. James Nathan, Executive Director of the Alabama World Affairs Council, about Cuba today and the opportunity to travel there to meet with dignitaries. Dr. Nathan has worked in several Latin American countries as a Foreign Service officer. The trip is being sponsored by the World Affairs Council of the U.S.

-Broadcast on January 14:

A discussion with guest Burton Ward, President of the Central Alabama Community Foundation, about the issue of community violence. The foundation is funding a \$100,000 grant competition to address violence in the River Region of Alabama.

-Broadcast on January 17:

A discussion by phone from Birmingham with guest Chandler Champion, the reigning Miss Alabama, about several of her literacy initiatives in schools and libraries. Since the age of eight, she has spearheaded school literacy projects and helped build libraries.

-Broadcast on January 22:

A discussion with guests Montgomery Tai Chi instructors Janet Hutto and Elaine Ward, with longtime Tai Chi practitioner Bill Griffin, about using Tai Chi to recover from health conditions - surgery, stroke, etc.

-Broadcast on January 27:

A discussion with guests Kristy Meanor, Executive Director of the Wetumpka Depot Players, and Elizabeth Bowles, attorney and actor, about the play, "The Miracle Worker," about Helen Keller and Annie Sullivan. The guests talk as parents of children with disabilities about the impact of these two icons on their lives.

-Broadcast on February 3:

A discussion with guests Dr. Lawrence Korb, Senior Fellow at the Center for American Progress and former Assistant Secretary of Defense, and Dr. James Nathan, Executive Director of the Alabama World Affairs Council, about the War on Terror, the U.S. Defense Budget, and security concerns about the Winter Olympics in Sochi, Russia. Dr. Korb has been in charge of security at several previous Olympics.

-Broadcast on February 13:

A discussion by phone with guest Dr. Joyce de Vries, Director of the Women's Studies Program at Auburn University, about activist Gloria Steinem, who will deliver the Extraordinary Women Lecture at Auburn. Steinem's focus has expanded from feminist issues to the quest for empowerment and equality for all citizens.

-Broadcast on February 17:

A discussion with guest Rabbi Elliot Stevens of Montgomery's Temple Beth Or about George Washington's letter on religious tolerance. European Jews emigrated to America for a better life, yet retained their cultural identity and traditions.

-Broadcast on February 18:

A discussion by phone from West Palm Beach, Florida, with guest Denny Abbott, formerly the youngest Chief Probation Officer in the U.S. In the 1960s he undertook reform of the Montgomery Juvenile Detention system, in an effort to redirect young lives. Today the Montgomery detention facility is a model.

-Broadcast on February 27:

A discussion with guest Ron Leonard, Director of the Network of Academic Libraries for the Alabama Commission on Higher Education, about the extensive resources for job seekers that the Virtual Library provides.

-Broadcast on February 28:

A discussion with guest Dr. Iris Xu, Director of the Troy University Confucius Institute, about Alabama as a participant in the global market. Alabama companies are now doing business with China, so the Confucius Institute has language training available.

-Broadcast on March 3:

A discussion with guests Dr. Sara Kosiba, MS Society volunteer, and Sheondra Dotson, college student with multiple sclerosis, about living with a condition that affects the body in numerous ways. Babies and adults can have MS, and early diagnosis and treatment are critical. The annual MS Walks are awareness campaigns.

-Broadcast on March 11:

A discussion with guest Itonde Kakoma, Assistant Director of the Conflict Resolution Program at the Carter Center in Atlanta, about the center's peace initiatives in Sudan and South Sudan. The Carter Center continues its disease eradication efforts in Africa. Joining the discussion was guest Dr. James Nathan, Executive Director of the Alabama World Affairs Council.

-Broadcast on March 14:

A discussion with guest Kyle McKinney, Public Affairs Specialist with the Social Security Administration, about changes to Social Security in 2014. Most Social Security business can now be conducted online. Form 1099 for tax purposes can be downloaded.

-Broadcast on March 21:

A discussion with guest Wiley Blankenship, President/CEO of Coastal Alabama Partnership, about escalating flood insurance rates for residents living along the coast or along rivers or streams. Floodplain maps are being drafted, resulting in higher insurance rates for homeowners, in an effort to make the federal flood insurance program solvent. Currently Congress is working on a solution.

B. Historical Issues

-Broadcast on January 7:

A discussion with guest Doyle Sapp, who has served as an Interpretive Ranger at National Parks across the U.S. We looked at history through his eyes, for a sense of the importance of the National Park System in preserving American history. Currently he serves as Superintendent of Horseshoe Bend National Military Park.

-Broadcast on January 20 :

A discussion by phone from Oakland, CA, with guest Juanita Brown, co-producer of the "Traces of the Trade" documentary, which tells the story of one family's slave trading legacy.

-Broadcast on January 24:

A discussion by phone from Eufaula, AL, with guest Stephen Rowe, Curator of the Eufaula Athenaeum, about the publication of the "A.S. Williams III Americana Collection," containing rare historical documents.

-Broadcast on February 4:

A discussion with guest historian Mary Ann Neeley, about the escalation of war between white settlers and Creek Indians over Alabama territory 200 years ago.

-Broadcast on February 5:

A discussion with guest archaeologist Teresa Paglione, board member of the Alabama Archaeological Society, about the Clovis points and other artifacts being found in the Wiregrass section of Alabama. Native American habitation dates back thousands of years.

-Broadcast on February 10:

A discussion with guest Brian Roslund, President of the Friends of the Roosevelt Little White House in Warm Springs, Ga., about the ties of several U.S. Presidents to the State of Georgia - Woodrow Wilson, FDR, and Jimmy Carter. Roslund delved into the events surrounding FDR's initial visit to Georgia for relief from the effects of polio, and FDR's subsequent investment in the Warm Springs community.

-Broadcast on February 12:

An on-location visit to the new Museum of Alabama/Voices of Alabama exhibit capturing 300 years of Alabama history. Guest Steve Murray, Director of the Alabama Department of Archives and History, discussed the people and the changes of three centuries.

-Broadcast on February 14:

An on-location visit to the F. Scott and Zelda Fitzgerald Museum in Montgomery, with guests Willie Thompson, Executive Director, and Dr. Kirk Curnutt, Fitzgerald Scholar and Professor of English at Troy University Montgomery. The guests discussed the artistic dynamics of the couple's relationship. They lived at the residence in Montgomery for a year.

-Broadcast on February 20:

A discussion by phone from Atlanta with guest Dr. Bernard LaFayette, Scholar-in-Residence at the Candler School of Theology at Emory University, about his experiences as a Freedom Rider and as organizer of the Selma Voter Registration Campaign. Librarian guests Rebie Morris and Zella Ques Holmes of the Montgomery City County Library joined the discussion.

-Broadcast on February 21:

A discussion with guest playwright Dyann Robinson, Founder and Director of the Tuskegee Repertory Theatre, about the racial strife surrounding the creation of the Tuskegee Veterans Administration Hospital in 1923. Her play, "Moton, A Moment of Crisis," captures the era and the struggle to save the hospital.

-Broadcast on February 24 and on March 20:

A two-part discussion with guests Ken Johnston, Executive Director, and Libba Beaucham, Communications Director, about the National Civil War Naval Museum at Port Columbus, Ga.,. The guests discussed the battles for naval supremacy in the Civil War and talked about the Congressman Robert Smalls exhibit. Smalls was a former slave who escaped by sailing the CSS Planter to Union lines. The March 20 program featured the stories of historical characters who lived and worked on the banks of the Chattahoochee River.

-Broadcast on March 5:

A discussion with guest Dr. Wayne Barr, Director of the Tuskegee Golden Voices Choir, about the importance of preserving African American Spirituals. From traditional spirituals to spirituals from contemporary composers, the William Levi Dawson Institute features choirs and lectures on this unique contribution to music.

-Broadcast on March 12:

A discussion by phone from Auburn with guest Pete Turnham, former State Representative and Monuments Man in World War II, about his experiences guarding art treasures at a German castle near the Austria border that were stolen by the Nazis in World War II.

-Broadcast on March 13:

A discussion with guest Dr. Kathryn Floyd, Assistant Professor of Art History at Auburn University, about the story of the Monuments Men and the scope of the art heist by the Nazis. Hitler failed as an art student, and his obsession with art may have driven his desire to confiscate the great art masterpieces. As an art historian, Dr. Floyd has traveled to the locations featured in the art heist.

-Broadcast on March 18:

A discussion with guests Dr. Stephen McNair, Historic Sites Director for the Alabama Historical Commission, and Ove Jensen, Site Director of Fort Toulouse/Fort Jackson Park, about several events of historic significance and plans to observe these events with living history programs. The period of 1813-1814 shaped Alabama's future, with battles that changed the power structure between white settlers and native inhabitants.

-Broadcast on March 25:

A discussion with guests Turia Stark Williams and Rabbi Elliot Stevens about Sephardic Jewish heritage and music. For a thousand years in Spain, the Sephardic culture flourished, until they were expelled in 1492 by reigning Catholics. Sephardic music is unique, due to the Moorish influence.

-Broadcast on March 27:

A discussion by phone from Knoxville, Tennessee, with guest Dr. Daniel Feller, Professor of History at the University of Tennessee at Knoxville and Editor/Director of "The Papers of Andrew Jackson," and in-studio with guest Dr. Mark Wilson, historian and Secretary of the Alabama Historical Association, about the conflicted legacy of Andrew Jackson. His national reputation was launched at the Battle of Horseshoe Bend, but he bears responsibility for sending Native Americans, including those who fought with him at the famed Alabama battle, on the Trail of Tears.

C. Environmental Issues

-Broadcast on January 16:

A discussion with guests Jennifer Hutcheson, Curator of Education at the City of Montgomery Zoo, and Ken Naugher, Manager of Enrichment and Conservation, about the zoo's participation in several global species preservation projects.

-Broadcast on March 7:

A discussion with guest Fred Bassett, Master Bird Bander and Founder of the nonprofit Hummingbird Research.net organization, about the effects of the severe winter weather on hummingbirds that wintered in the Southeast. Answer: they put on additional fat and survived!
