Section 1. Issues.

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community this quarter:

- A. Societal Issues:** The National Endowment for the Arts Big Read - Book about African American family ties; WTSU Radio Reading Service for blind and print-impaired listeners; Montgomery Symphony's Blount Slawson Young Artists Concerto Competition; Dothan's Aunt Katie's (inner city) Garden for education and economic development; Alabama Shakespeare Festival's plays for children and families; America's Big Recession and its impact on Alabama investors; Adaptive farm equipment for people with disabilities; Children's math and science outdoor day camp; Saving east Alabama's Saugahatchee Creek from pollution; The Wellness Coalition's Healthy Corner Stores project; Environmental educator/ storyteller Renee Raney's use of folklore to connect children and families with nature; Coosa River update; Better Business Bureau consumer tips; Alabama State Parks update; Elder abuse; Black Bears in Alabama.
- B. Historical Issues:** The Helen Keller story; The Old Federal Road and its role as a political epicenter in Alabama's path to statehood; Alabama's historic courthouses and their stories; Trenholm Court housing project history in Montgomery; Writer Carson McCullers; Heritage of Wooden Boatbuilding; Eugene Bullard, WWI, the world's first African American fighter pilot; Pioneering movie theaters in central Alabama; Juneteenth celebration of emancipation; Preserving a 19th century Wiregrass farmhouse; The Axeman of New Orleans and rise of the Mafia.

Section II. Responsive Programs

The station has broadcast programming dealing with each of these issues. Programming on *In Focus* with host Carolyn Hutcheson covered each issue in a 9-minute time frame at 12:40 p.m. during the *Here and Now* news hour.

Note:

Mondays and Fridays at 12:34 p.m., Don Dailey of Alabama Public Television's *Capitol Journal*, presented a 4 -minute recap of the week's political news with the *NewsWrap* and the *Buzzword*.

A. Societal Issues:

- Broadcast on April 20:

A conversation by Skype with New York guest Tayari Jones, author of *Silver Sparrow*, chosen as the NEA Big Read, and in-studio guest Troy English Professor Kirk Curnutt, about unusual family dynamics - bigamy, in this African American story. Troy University is sponsoring a lecture by Jones, who also will appear at the Alabama Book Festival.

-Broadcast on April 25:

A conversation with guests Jim Young, WTSU Radio Reading Service volunteer since 1997, and Karl Wade, blind advocate and one of the organizers of the service in 1997, about how the program operates with volunteer readers to bring news from the *Montgomery Advertiser* to blind and print-impaired listeners on a special radio receiver. The guests also talked about how to get a radio receiver from the Alabama Dept. of Rehabilitation Services.

-Broadcast on April 26:

A conversation with guest Thomas Hinds, music director and conductor of the Montgomery Symphony Orchestra, about the Blount Slawson Young Artists Concerto Competition - a project begun by philanthropist Winton "Red" Blount, to encourage young talent in their pursuit of a career in music. Teenagers from across the U.S. can enter, and this year's winner, Tyler Kim, will play Chopin at the next MSO concert.

-Broadcast on May 2:

A conversation by Skype with Dothan guest Michael Jackson, president of the DuBois Institute, about the role of Aunt Katie's Community Garden in educating and providing food for a low-income African American neighborhood. Jackson spearheads the economic development initiatives of the garden and teaches about the value of healthy food choices. He's on the State Obesity Task Force.

-Broadcast on May 4:

An on-location conversation with guest Geoffrey Sherman, producing artistic director of the Alabama Shakespeare Festival, about his priorities for the past twelve years - bringing families and children to the theater, as well as bringing theater to schools and students. Sherman will retire in July.

-Broadcast on May 10:

A conversation with guest Joseph Borg, director of the Alabama Securities Commission, about America's Big Recession and its impact on Alabama investors. The ASC tallied up the money that has been returned to investors who were scammed, and Borg talked about money the ASC has given to the state's General Fund from licensing fees, litigation, and settlements.

-Broadcast on May 18:

A conversation by Skype with Indiana guest Bill Begley about adaptive farm equipment designed by a creative farmer, Hubert Von Holten, whose life was changed by polio. Von Holten works with Purdue University to implement his designs, which enable a farmer to keep farming, despite having a disability. Begley will be in Montgomery May 23 for the Disability Expo and bring equipment from the company, Life Essentials, for participants to try out.

-Broadcast on May 23:

An on-location conversation at the Alabama Nature Center, recorded in July, 2016, with guest Kristin Irons, wildlife biologist, about the value of giving children an outdoor experience through day camp. Irons had just finished a popular educational program about reptiles in the center's classroom, and she talked about Gross Out Camp for children ages 6 to as a hands-on math and science camp offered by the nonprofit Fresh Air Family. As a recent college graduate and Nature Center educator, Irons is committed to offering an outdoor counterpoint to children's heavy usage of electronic devices.

-Broadcast on May 24:

A conversation with guests Cliff Weber, chairman of the Save Our Saugahatchee volunteer group, and Clara Clothiyo, the 'E-Coli' lady, about east Alabama's Saugahatchee Creek. They told the story of discovering heavy pollution from a textile company, as well as E-Coli bacteria, runoff, and sedimentation from other sources, and how several entities cooperated to clean up the creek- citizen volunteers, public officials, foresters, and industry.

-Broadcast on May 31:

A conversation with guests Dr. Cythia Bisbee, psychologist and director of The Wellness Coalition, and Ghandi Williams, social worker, about a new successful project to enlist help from River Region convenience stores to offer fresh produce from area farmers to customers as a healthier food alternative. A companion program enlists help from area churches for training in chronic disease management for members of their congregations.

-Broadcast on June 1:

A conversation by Skype to Florida with guest Renee Simmons Raney, storyteller, environmental educator, and author of *Hairy, Scary, but Mostly Merry Fairies*, about her use of imagination and folklore to connect children and families to the outdoors. She is known for building “fairy houses” with natural materials, thus examining the forest floor and its environs. Raney will assume a leadership post at Cheaha State Park in Alabama.

-Broadcast on June 7:

A conversation by Skype with Birmingham guest David Smitherman, president and CEO of the Better Business Bureau of Central and South Alabama, with tips for consumers on handling door-to-door salesmen promoting home security systems.

-Broadcast on June 8:

A conversation with guest Lonnie Carden, president of the Coosa River Paddling Club, about the health of the Coosa River. With advocacy efforts from fishermen, recreational boaters, and conservation organizations, and regulations by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, the Coosa is healthier today than forty years ago. Creek Indians used the Coosa as their river “highway,” and the City of Wetumpka depends on its water. Carden also previewed the Coosa Whitewater Festival.

-Broadcast on June 20:

A conversation with guest Greg Lein, Alabama State Parks director, about the status of the state parks since voters overwhelmingly endorsed Amendment 2 last November, restoring Parks funding that the legislature had previously used to augment the General Fund. The rural parks that were lost are now operated by local government entities and are open to the public. Lein said that Parks maintenance is now on track for 2017.

-Broadcast on June 27:

A conversation with guest AARP Senior Vice-President Kristin Dillon about efforts to educate the public about the issue of elder abuse. Dillon said that AARP has compiled resource tools to help families recognize and report elder abuse, whether physical, emotional, or financial. June is Elder Abuse Awareness Month.

-Broadcast on June 29:

A conversation with guests Thomas Harms, Large Carnivore coordinator, and Marianne Hudson, Wildlife rehabilitator and Conservation educator, with the Alabama Dept. of Conservation and Natural Resources, about the emergence of black bears in Alabama. The guests talked about black bear behavior, with tips on what to do when in the vicinity of a black bear, including if a bear attacks. Black bears are using natural corridors, e.g. from Pine Mountain, Ga., through Tuskegee National Forest in Al., to find food and territory. Other bear populations are in southwest and northeast Al., as well as the Florida Panhandle.

B. Historical Issues:

-Broadcast on April 19:

A conversation by Skype with Dothan guest Eddie Farnham, co-director of the play, *The Miracle Worker*, about Helen Keller and her teacher Annie Sullivan. The Southeast Alabama Community Theater cast visited the Keller birthplace in north Alabama for research into her life, and the production includes ASL Interpreters for hearing impaired audience members.

-Broadcast on April 27:

A conversation with guests Gary Burton, president of the Pintlala Historical Association, and Christy Anderson, Historic Preservation officer for the City of Montgomery, about The Old Federal Road as a political epicenter in Alabama's path to statehood. The Gathering Year, a Montgomery County Bicentennial History project, will recognize community family and oral histories.

-Broadcast on May 3:

A conversation with guest Delos Hughes, political scientist, about the history of Alabama courthouses. He is author of the book, *Historic Alabama Courthouses, A Century of Their Images and Stories*, and he discussed design influences, builders, and the stories behind Montgomery and Wiregrass courthouses.

-Broadcast on May 9:

A conversation with guest Professor Keith Hebert of Auburn U., about his field work gathering oral histories for the Montgomery County Bicentennial. He shared a recorded conversation with Leon Vandiver, a former resident of Trenholm Court housing project. Vandiver told how the construction of I-85 and I-65 through Montgomery destroyed his old neighborhood, and residents were moved to Trenholm Court, a new project. He related stories about the pride the residents had in Trenholm Court, and Hebert summarized the community side of the Civil Rights era.

-Broadcast on May 16:

A conversation by Skype with Mobile guest Sue Brannon Walker, who has researched the life of Columbus, Ga, author Carson McCullers and written a book of poems, *It's Good Weather for Fudge*, about McCullers' themes of love, loneliness, and music. Walker also talked about her sense of literary and Southern kinship with McCullers, though they were of different generations.

-Broadcast on May 17:

An on-location conversation recorded in January in Apalachicola, Fl, with guest Captain George Floyd, founder and chairman of the nonprofit Apalachicola Maritime Museum, about its Wooden Boat School, where participants learn the heritage techniques of building kayaks, pirogues, rowing shells, and other types of wooden boats. Floyd's great-grandfather, Samuel Floyd, was a mariner who worked in Columbus, Ga, and later settled in Apalachicola, Fl.

-Broadcast on May 30:

A conversation by Skype with New Mexico guest Larry Greenly about Eugene Bullard, son of a former Columbus, Ga. slave. Eugene Bullard moved to France and later flew for the French in World War I, since the U.S. refused to have African American fighter pilots. He was awarded 15 medals for heroism, was made a Knight of the Legion of Honor, and was congratulated by Charles de Gaulle. Greenly's book is *Eugene Bullard, World's First Black Fighter Pilot*.

-Broadcast on June 13:

A conversation with guest Martin McCaffery, director of Montgomery's independent Capri Movie Theater and collector of early movie theater memorabilia, about the role of pioneering movie theaters in the cultural history of early 20th century Alabama. The government also provided movie theaters for soldiers' entertainment during the war years.

-Broadcast on June 14:

A conversation by Skype with Birmingham guest A. Faye Boykin Calhoun, about Juneteenth and its commemoration of the end of slavery. First observed in Texas on June 19, 1865, the emancipation proclamation actually took place two years earlier. Calhoun spoke at the 2016 Troy University Rosa Parks Juneteenth occasion, and this year the museum will host a all-day Juneteenth block party on June 17.

-Broadcast on June 15:

A conversation by Skype with Dothan guest Mary Jo Woodham at Dothan Area Botanical Gardens about the 19th century farmhouse that she and other volunteers preserved, with help from a local school and the business community. The farmhouse project was done as a tribute to the Wiregrass farming community, and the structure can now be used for community events.

-Broadcast on June 22:

A conversation with Montgomery guest historian Miriam C. Davis about the American South's own version of Jack the Ripper - the Axeman of New Orleans in the early 20th century. Davis discussed the arrival of immigrants from Sicily, whose Mafia connections were thought to be related to the axe murderer, yet the murders were never solved. Her book explored the times and circumstances in *The Axeman of New Orleans*.
