

THIRD QUARTER ISSUES PROGRAMS LIST FOR TROY UNIVERSITY PUBLIC RADIO

July 1 – September 30, 2012

Placed in the Public File October 9, 2012

Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community this quarter:

- A. Environmental Issues:** Longleaf Pine Ecosystem; Whitewater Columbus and the Apalachicola-Chattahoochee-Flint Stakeholders' efforts toward a Sustainable Water Management Plan for the 19,000 square-mile watershed; Hummingbird Science; Drought and its Effects (three-part series); Chattahoochee Trace; Urban – Rural Land Use Issues.
- B. Societal Issues:** Literacy; Reintroduction of Ex-prisoners into Society; Myasathenia Gravis; Social Security and Medicare; Homeland Security; Pre-K School Readiness; new Federal Courthouse Complex for Middle District of Alabama; Fitness; Alabama's Civic Health Index; Community Support for Schools; Help for Wounded Warriors; School Dropouts; Homeless Pets; Municipal Land Use Planning; Accelerated College Enrollment for High School Students; Closure of Psychiatric Hospitals in Alabama; People with Disabilities; Education for Military Families of Soldiers Killed or Wounded; West Nile Virus; World Affairs; Contemporary Indians in Alabama; Alzheimer's Disease.
- C. Historical Issues:** Mid-16th Century Route of Spanish Conquistador Hernando De Soto through Alabama - a Historical Mystery (two-part series); How Archaeology Educates Citizens about early Alabamians; the Fort Mims Massacre; the Montgomery Bus Boycott in the Civil Rights Era; Surviving the Titanic; Mill Villages of East Alabama; Civil War Music.

Section II: Responsive Programs.

The station has broadcast programming dealing with each of the above-referenced issues. Programming on *Community Focus*, with host Carolyn Hutcheson, dealt with each issues in a 14-minute time frame, beginning at 12:10 p.m. Central time, each weekday.

A. Environmental Issues:

-Broadcast on July 2:

A discussion with guest Mark Hains, Research Coordinator with the nonprofit Longleaf Alliance, at the Solon Dixon Forestry Center in Andalusia. He described the flora and fauna of the Longleaf Pine ecosystem and efforts to restore the Longleaf Pine to its native habitat in our coverage area.

-Broadcast on July 5:

A discussion with guests Billy Turner, Vice-President of the nonprofit ACF (Apalachicola-Chattahoochee-Flint Rivers) Stakeholders Organization, and Carole Rutland, Governing Board member, about Whitewater Columbus, the construction of the world's longest (2 ½-mile) urban whitewater course on the Chattahoochee River. The guests discussed efforts by the ACF Stakeholders in Georgia, Alabama and Florida, to draft a Sustainable Water Management Plan for the 19,000-mile watershed of the three rivers.

-Broadcast on July 6:

A discussion by phone with Fred Bassett, federally licensed Master Bird Bander with the nonprofit Hummingbird Research Group, while he was in Boise, Idaho, about his hummingbird findings in the Western U.S. So far he had banded 1200 hummers, twice what he had banded last year.

-Broadcast on Aug. 2:

A discussion by phone with guest Steve Musser, Assistant State Conservationist for Programs for the Alabama Natural Resources Conservation Service (formerly the U.S. Soil Conservation Service), about the drought, NRCS drought mitigation and other soil conservation programs available to landowners, along with financial assistance.

-Broadcast on Aug. 6:

A discussion by phone with guest Brandon Dillard, Regional Agronomist for the Wiregrass with the Alabama Cooperative Extension System, about the drought's effects on southeast Alabama farmers. He talked about corn, peanuts, and cotton, and the costs, challenges, and impact on consumers.

-Broadcast on Aug. 16:

In this final summer program about the Alabama Drought, guest John McMillan, Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries for Alabama, discussed how the department is helping farmers combat drought by developing irrigation for row crop farmland. He addressed the department's funding shortfall (loss of one-fourth of the staff) and how it is still working to protect the consumer food supply.

-Broadcast on Aug. 29:

An update with guest Mike Bunn, Executive Director of the Historic Chattahoochee Commission, a State Agency of Alabama and Georgia, about the new Creek Wars/Creek Removal Interpretive Trail, and the Education and Interpretation Grant program for communities seeking to preserve the history, culture and ecology of the historic Chattahoochee (River) Trace geographic area.

-Broadcast on Sept. 24:

A discussion with guest Adam Snyder, Executive Director of the Conservation Alabama Foundation, about land use issues – the Complete Streets program for

cities, Alabama's Landfill Moratorium, the ADEM Solid Waste Study Committee, and the Forever Wild program's preservation of 220,000 acres for public use (the lowest acreage of any Southeastern state).

B. Societal & Health Issues:

-Broadcast on July 11:

A discussion with guests Sue Edge, Executive Director of the Lee County Literacy Coalition, and Katie Jackson, Board member and also President of the East Alabama Chapter of the Public Relations Council of Alabama, about the efforts of volunteers in both organizations to provide free tutoring to Lee County citizens, to develop and improve their reading, writing and math skills, as well as offer GED preparation.

-Broadcast on July 16:

A discussion with guests Dana Dunklin, Executive Director of the nonprofit Renaissance, a Montgomery residential program for men who are non-violent ex-offenders recently paroled from prison, and LaHorace Wright, resident, about the structured environment offering opportunity for recovery, growth, responsibility, and help obtaining employment and further education.

-Broadcast on July 18:

A discussion with guests Staci Machado, RN, Support Group Facilitator, and Arlene Stuckey, RN, Board member, about the Myasthenia Gravis Foundation of America and the work of the Alabama Chapter, with its telephone support network across our coverage area. The guests talked about the characteristics of myasthenia gravis, its diagnosis, and treatment.

-Broadcast on July 20:

A discussion with guest Kyle' McKinney, Public Affairs Specialist with the Social Security Administration, about the Online Social Security Statement, and Enrollment Periods for Medicare Parts B and D. He also talked about scams to be aware of and gave advice on how to prevent identity theft while traveling.

-Broadcast on July 23:

A discussion with guest Spencer Collier, Director of the Alabama Department of Homeland Security, with an update on the Governor's Law Enforcement Task Force, the Fusion Center, the D-Block Wireless Broadband Initiative, terrorism, immigration and human/drug trafficking, the E-Verify program for small businesses, and Ready Alabama Day Sept. 6.

-Broadcast on July 24:

A discussion with guest Allison de la Torre, Executive Director of the Alabama School Readiness Alliance, about pre-kindergarten education and opportunities in Alabama.

-Broadcast on July 27:

A discussion with guest Reggie Hamner, Court Project Coordinator for the Frank M. Johnson, Jr., Federal Courthouse Complex for the Middle District of Alabama, about the artistic, architectural and construction features of this award-winning design, on the tenth anniversary of occupancy.

-Broadcast on July 30:

A discussion with guest Don Drenth (Col. USAF, Ret.) about her trek at age 64 up Mount Kilimanjaro in Africa. Returning to Alabama, she founded a hiking club, and she talked about her training routine in preparation for her upcoming mountain treks abroad. Hiking is her form of Senior fitness.

-Broadcast on July 31:

A discussion with guests Chris McCauley, Executive Director of the David Mathews Center for Civic Life, and Dr. Mark Wilson, Director of Civic Initiatives at Auburn University's College of Liberal Arts, about the Alabama Civic Health Index, Social Connectedness, and Community Involvement. Dr. Wilson talked about how a recent Civic Awareness project in Macon County was carried out by teenagers.

-Broadcast on Aug. 1:

A discussion by phone with guest Lavonda Gosselin, Program Director for Adopt A School Dothan, a program of Yes We Can! Dothan, about grassroots community efforts to support Dothan public schools. Campaigns include collecting band instruments, school supplies, and physical education equipment.

-Broadcast on Aug. 3:

A discussion with guest John Benton of Prattville about A Hero's Project, a nonprofit established by U.S. Marine Captain Lee Stuckey to establish a recreational facility in east Alabama for injured soldiers returning from combat. John updated the listeners on his own volunteer efforts to deliver school supplies each month to the Mississippi Gulf Coast, which is still rebounding from Hurricane Katrina. John has made over fifty trips since the storm struck the coast.

-Broadcast on Aug. 7:

A discussion by phone with guest Julie Mullins-Turner, School Improvement Specialist for the Dothan City Schools, about the Dropout Prevention Plan that has resulted in a dramatic decrease in the number of high school students dropping out before graduation – from more than 100, down to three students. She explained the academic team approach, community partnerships, and parental involvement as keys to success.

-Broadcast on Aug. 8:

A discussion with guests Dennis Michele of Asheville, N.C. and Southeast Regional Director of the American Volkspport Association, and Diane McFarland of Alexander City and President of the Capital City Wanderers, about the AVA,

a nonprofit international organization devoted to fitness through group walks in the out-of-doors.

-Broadcast on Aug. 10:

A discussion with guest Lorna Aho, President of the Macon County Humane Society, about the nonprofit organization's efforts to foster, adopt out, and relay adoptable animals to other states. She also gave advice on traveling with pets in hot weather.

-Broadcast on Aug. 13:

A discussion with guest Justin Steinmann, Principal Planner for the City of Auburn, with an update on the award-winning Comp 2030, a comprehensive land use plan for the City, developed with extensive public input. He talked about how public involvement can shape a city's economic future and help tackle traffic issues and sprawl, redevelopment, health, and quality of life.

-Broadcast on Aug. 21:

A discussion by phone with guest Angela Sullivan, ACCELERATE Program Coordinator for Troy University, about the online dual enrollment program for high school students, giving them the opportunity to earn both college and high school credit while still in high school. To help families with expenses, Troy University has dramatically reduced tuition for high school students who enroll in ACCELERATE, and Angela mentioned other colleges that offer similar programs to high school students.

-Broadcast on Aug. 23:

A discussion with guest Montgomery attorney Will O'Rear, Alabama Vice-President of NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) and former Family Court Judge who was also trained as a Professional Counselor, about the impact of Psychiatric Hospital closings in Alabama. He addressed Probate Court/ Involuntary Commitment, the need for hospital beds for psychiatric patients, Crisis Units, Group Homes, and Crisis Intervention.

-Broadcast on Aug. 27:

A discussion with guest Graham Sisson, Executive Director of the Alabama Governor's Office on Disabilities and Assistant Attorney General, about Disability issues. The agency's mission is to facilitate the inclusion of Alabamians with disabilities in education, employment, housing, transportation, health care, and leisure. People with disabilities are the largest minority group in the U.S.

-Broadcast on Aug. 28:

A discussion by phone (from Jacksonville, FL) with guest Joseph Houghton, Troy University Director of Military Programs – Global Campus, about Patriot Golf Day, a nationwide fundraiser held Labor Day Weekend for the Folds of Honor Foundation. Since 2007, Patriot Golf Day has raised \$12.8 million and awarded

2,600 post-secondary educational scholarships for the children and spouses of men and women killed or disabled while serving in the U.S. Military. Five thousand golf courses across the U.S. are participating this year in Patriot Golf Day.

Broadcast on Sept. 4:

-A discussion with guest Dr. Mary McIntyre, M.D., M.P.H., Assistant State Health Officer for Disease Control and Prevention and Acting State Epidemiologist for the Alabama Department of Public Health, about West Nile Virus – the symptoms and risks, how it is spread, and how people can lessen their chances of catching the disease.

Broadcast on Sept. 5:

-A discussion with guest Lt. General Charles Cleveland, USAF Ret., President of the Alabama World Affairs Council, about the lecture series on international events and global issues. He talked about Cuba and previewed Dr. Brian Latell's Sept. 11th lecture as a noted expert on Cuba and the Castro brothers.

Broadcast on Sept. 11:

-A discussion with guest Eloise Josey, Executive Director of the Alabama Indian Affairs Commission, a State agency, about the 60,000 contemporary American Indians in Alabama's nine Indian tribes. American Indians gained citizenship in the 1930s, and she talked about the difference between Federally recognized tribes and State recognized tribes, as well as myths and misconceptions about the Indian population today.

Broadcast on Sept. 19:

-A discussion with guest Sharon Ward, Deputy Director of the Alabama Governor's Office on Disabilities, with a preview of the 2012 Alabama Disabilities Summit & Expo Sept. 27.

Broadcast on Sept. 21:

-A discussion by phone from Dothan with Kay Jones, Director of the nonprofit Alzheimer's Resource Center, about Alzheimer's Disease and treatment modes. Statistically, by age 85, one in two people will have the brain disease, for which there currently is no cure. She previewed the Walk to Remember Oct. 6 and also discussed the Alzheimer's educational packets available to families, as well as support groups and telephone counseling for caregivers.

C. Historical Issues:

-Broadcast on July 10:

A discussion with guest archaeologists Ned Jenkins of the Alabama Historical Commission's Fort Toulouse/Fort Jackson Park, and Dr. Craig Sheldon, AHC Commissioner, about their research into this mid-16th century route through

Alabama of Spanish Conquistador Hernando De Soto, one of North America's historical mysteries. Both archaeologists contributed essays to the book, *The Search for Mabila*. Part one of a two-part interview program.

Broadcast on July 12:

A discussion with guest Teresa Paglione, President of the Alabama Archaeological Society, about archaeological sites the public can visit in Alabama and Georgia. She shared the news that a De Soto contact site was just discovered in north Florida.

-Broadcast on Aug. 9:

An on-location archaeological site discussion with guest archaeologists Teresa Paglione, President of the Alabama Archaeological Society; Jason Mann, Director of the Troy University Archaeological Research Center; and Jon Macoux, Assistant Professor of Anthropology at Auburn University Montgomery, about Indian occupation of Alabama prior to the arrival of Europeans. The Alabama River site, which features a Woodland occupation, serves as a Field School for Troy University archaeology students, with AUM students joining this summer.

-Broadcast on Aug. 20:

A discussion by phone with guests - the Honorable Richard Bender Abell, retired Federal Judge and Senior Vice-Commander of The Order of the Indian Wars (by phone from Alexandria, VA), and in-studio Justin James Rojek, member of the Order, about the Fort Mims Massacre Aug. 30, 1813, a pivotal event in American history. The Order is working with the Fort Mims Restoration Association to erect a monument at the site.

-Broadcast on Aug. 24:

A discussion with guests Reverend Bob and Jeannie Graetz, well-known activists in the Montgomery Bus Boycott. They recounted how their home was bombed several times, as they were targeted by the Ku Klux Klan during the Bus Boycott in the 1950s. August 25 is the anniversary of one of the bombings.

-Broadcast on Aug. 31:

A discussion with guest Julie Hedgepeth-Williams of Birmingham, about the sinking of the Titanic and the members of her family who survived the disaster. She talked about how the tragedy affected the family, and she later wrote down their stories for the book, *A Rare Titanic Family, The Caldwell's Story of Survival*.

-Broadcast on Sept. 3 – Labor Day:

A discussion hosted by Kyle Gassiott with guest Skip Lanier, who talked about working for 33 years at the Pepperell Manufacturing Co. textile mill in Opelika. The Pepperell Mill opened in 1925, and the Pepperell Mill Village, with some 200 structures, is under consideration to be added to the National Register of Historic Places.

-Broadcast on Sept. 14:

A discussion by phone from Birmingham with Bobby Horton, composer and music historian, and in-studio with Dr. Kristen Koehler, Director of the Troy University Davis Theatre, about the role music played in the Civil War. He talked about music of the North and South and how it affected soldiers on the battlefield. He previewed the Sept. 19th Alabama Symphony concert, presenting Civil War music. Horton collaborated with filmmaker Ken Burns on the acclaimed PBS Civil War series.

-Broadcast on Sept. 26:

A part II discussion with guest archaeologists Dr. Craig Sheldon, Commissioner with the Alabama Historical Commission, and Ned Jenkins, based at Fort Toulouse/Fort Jackson National Historic Landmark, operated by the Alabama Historical Commission, about the archaeological quest to pinpoint the route through Alabama of Spanish Conquistador Hernando De Soto in the 1500s, and locate the battle site of Mabila. The archaeologists contributed essays to the book, *The Search for Mabila, The Decisive Battle Between Hernando De Soto and Chief Tascalusa*.
