

## SECOND QUARTER ISSUES PROGRAMS LIST FOR TROY UNIVERSITY PUBLIC RADIO

April 1 – June 30, 2015

Submitted for the Public File July 10, 2015

### Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community this quarter:

- A. **Environmental Issues:** Hummingbird research and science; Kudzu, invasive species and food; Alabama State Parks in jeopardy; Outdoor education at Landmark Park in Dothan
- B. **Societal Issues:** Foreign policy issues affecting the US and our coverage area: Ukraine and the Russian advance; Personal finance issues (preventing tax identity theft, taxes, financial literacy, protecting seniors from financial scammers,); Helping prisoners express themselves through poetry; Social sculpture; the Writing Our Stories project for juvenile offenders; Sexual assault; the Alabama Writers Hall of Fame; Special Olympics; Troy Food Bank; Social Security; Music celebrating our farm roots; Cuba today; Coping with the death of adult children; Higher Education in Alabama; Athletics and head injury; the Troy University Rosa Parks Museum and new director; the Supreme Court as covered by NPR correspondent Nina Totenberg; Adoptions; Drug abuse and trafficking; Drone technology; Same sex marriage.
- C. **Historical Issues:** Music composers and little-known historical incidents; The Holocaust; Slavery in the South; Tuskegee University builder and architect Robert Taylor features on new postage stamp; The aftermath of the Civil War; Paleo Art; Smithsonian exhibit – Museum on Main Street: The Way We Worked; Mother of the Blues Ma Rainey; Art inspired by a WWII photograph; A unique photograph of Martin Luther King, Jr., and his family in Montgomery; Monuments Man Robert Kelly Posey of Morris, Alabama; WWII Army veteran Edward Stevens; World War I; the Timber industry and company towns.

### Section II: Responsive Programs

Broadcasts by the station dealt with programming on each of the above-referenced issues. Programming on *In Focus*, with host Carolyn Hutcherson, targeted each issue within an 8-minute time frame, between 12:06 and 12:30 p.m. weekdays. Note: the station also presented a four-part series created by WBHM-FM Public Radio in Birmingham, about the rise in heroin addiction in Alabama.

## **A. Environmental Issues:**

**-Broadcast on April 22, Earth Day:**

A 7-minute discussion with guest Fred Bassett, master bird bander , about the results of his decade-plus of hummingbird research, much of which was aided by the radio listeners in Alabama, Georgia and Florida. as he banded the wintering hummers in their yards. The research is changing hummingbird science, documenting the birds' flight ranges and lifespans.

**-Broadcast on April 22, Earth Day::**

A 4-minute discussion with guest Caroline Nabors Rosen about the emerging use of kudzu, an invasive plant species from Asia, as food. She talked about kudzu noodles, their nutrition, and recipes.

**-Broadcast on June 3:**

A discussion with guest Randy Jinks, promotions director for the Alabama State Parks, about the current question of how many parks will remain open. Funding is at stake, as lawmakers grapple with a state budget that has a multimillion-dollar deficit. Parks remain open at this time.

**-Broadcast on June 16:**

An on-site discussion at Dothan's Landmarks Park with guest Julie Heller, public relations director, about the key role the nonprofit park plans in offering outdoor education programs in the Wiregrass.

## **B. Societal & Health Issues:**

**-Broadcast on April 2:**

A discussion with guests Olexander Motsyk, Ukrainian Ambassador to the US, and James Nathan, Executive Director of the Alabama World Affairs Council, about the Russian incursion into Ukraine, and the Ukrainian response. The Oct. 9<sup>th</sup> Case Management Conference seeks to develop solutions.

**-Broadcast on April 6:**

A four-minute discussion with guest Lyvonnia Poppell, Montgomery CPA, about defending yourself against tax identity theft. Poppell is a member of the Alabama Society of Certified Public Accountants.

**-Broadcast on April 6:**

An 8-minute discussion with guest Auburn poet Kyes Stevens, Director of the Alabama Prison Poetry Workshop, about her work with inmates, who learn to create poetry that helps them work through their emotions. The station is broadcasting a series during National Poetry Month.

**-Broadcast on April 13:**

A discussion with guest Wayne Curtis, former Superintendent of Banking for Alabama and professor emeritus at Troy University, about tax day and financial literacy.

**-Broadcast on April 20:**

A discussion with guest Amanda Senn, General Counsel for the Alabama Securities Commission, about protecting senior citizens from financial scammers.

**-Broadcast on April 23:**

A discussion with guest Rick Lowe, an Alabamian who was inspired by German artist Joseph Boys, received a MacArthur Grant recipient, and founded a special kind of social sculpture, which fosters and serves community projects through his [projectrowhouses.org](http://projectrowhouses.org).

**-Broadcast on April 26:**

A discussion with guest Jeannie Thompson, poet and executive director of the Alabama Writers Forum, about the Writing Our Stories project for juvenile offenders. A hallmark of the project is it engenders youth to learn to experience empathy (for crime victims).

**-Broadcast on May 12:**

On International Nurses Day, an 8-minute discussion with guest LaDonna Patton, Troy University graduate and a sexual assault nurse examiner who works in the legal division of the Alabama Board of Nursing, about her work with sexual assault victims. She gave listeners red flags to look for in victim behavior.

**-Broadcast on May 12:**

A discussion with guest Jeannie Thompson, Executive Director of the Alabama Writers Forum, about the establishment of the Alabama Writers Hall of Fame.

**-Broadcast on May 13:**

Gold medal Special Olympic gymnast Emily Belk of Auburn was the guest, who talked about her quest to excel in this summer's International Games. She trains weekly in Marietta, Georgia, and she and her mother have served as volunteers at the US National Special Olympic Games. Troy University hosts the Alabama Special Olympic Games this year.

**-Broadcast on May 16:**

Producer David Caddell visited guest Luwanda Bell, youth coordinator of the Christian Love Center, the new food bank in Pike County opening in Troy. She discussed poverty and the need for food banks in smaller communities.

**-Broadcast on May 18:**

A 4-minute discussion with guest Kulle McKinney, public affairs specialist for the Social Security Administration, about Social Security benefits for families of soldiers who have died.

**-Broadcast on May 18:**

A 7-minute discussion with guest Rachel Osier of WBHM Birmingham about the scope of the problem of heroin addiction in Alabama. This kicks off the four-part series broadcast on heroin addiction created by the staff of WBHM-FM.

**-Broadcast on May 21:**

A discussion with guest writer Paul Harris of Auburn University about Alabama Monuments Man Robert Kelly Posey, who as an engineer was a visionary in protecting art stolen by the Nazis.

**-Broadcast on May 28:**

A discussion with Greenville guest singer-songwriter Rock Killough, about his poignant musical celebrations of our rural heritage. Killough also is a guest on the Sundilla Radio Hour.

**-Broadcast on May 27:**

A discussion by phone from Columbus, GA, with guests Jim and Carol Hutcheson, educators who recently visited Cuba on a tour of schools. Jim Hutcheson is a retired professor with Troy University Fort Benning, and Carol Hutcheson is a school principal in Columbus.

**-Broadcast on May 28:**

A discussion with guests Ed Jones and Karen Story, who have lost adult children to premature death. They talk about how they have coped with grief and found consolation participating in Compassionate Friends, a nonprofit organization that helps grieving families.

**-Broadcast on June 9:**

A discussion with guest Gregory Fitch, executive director of the Alabama Commission on Higher Education, with a "report card" on the status of higher education today. Fitch talked about the value of higher education and stressed that the state needs to create job opportunities for trained students, to keep them in their home state.

**-Broadcast on June 17:**

Producer Joey Hudson visited with guest Neal Brown, new head football coach at Troy University. Brown discussed the concerns about athletes and head injuries, the challenges of coaching, and the need for careful planning.

**-Broadcast on June 18:**

A discussion with guest Felecia Bell, the new director of the Troy University Rosa Parks Museum, about her projects at the US Capitol and her testimony before Congress about African American slaves who built the Capitol.

**-Broadcast on June 21:**

A discussion with guest Nina Totenberg about covering issues before the Supreme Court for NPR. She talked about this summer's current issues, such as gay marriage and redistricting, and the subsequent broad reach of Supreme Court rulings.

**-Broadcast on June 24:**

A discussion with guests Susan Moss and Beverly Owings, two adoptive mothers who work for the Children's Aid Society, about the need for adoptive families. Alabama has 250 children who have no "forever home," and the guest talk about adoption procedures.

**-Broadcast on June 25:**

A discussion with guests George Beck, US Attorney for the Middle District of Alabama, and Clay Morris, DEA Assistant Special Agent in Charge, about the alarming rise in drug-related deaths in Alabama. The guests expressed concerns about prescription drug abuse giving way to heroin use, and the drug trafficking interstate corridors that facilitate the problem.

**-Broadcast on June 30:**

A 7-minute discussion with guests Morris Lowery and Chris Holderith, former US Army instructors stationed at Fort Rucker. The guests are experts in drone technology and explained the growing uses of drones, as well as FAA regulations. The instructors are invested in the safety aspects of flying drones and urge anyone to get training before flying unmanned aircraft.

**C. Historical Issues:**

**-Broadcast on April 1:**

A discussion with guests George Del Gobbo, Conductor and Music Director of the Columbus, GA, Symphony, and Howard Goldstein, Conductor of the Auburn University Symphony Orchestra, about little-known historical aspects of composers' lives.

**-Broadcast on April 7:**

A discussion by phone from Birmingham with two guests who survived the Holocaust – Max Herzel, who arrived in the US after WWII and served four years in the US Air Force, and Max Steinmetz, originally from Romania, whose family were killed in the concentration camps. Both guests are presenters at the annual Holocaust Education Symposium April 15 in Montgomery.

**-Broadcast on April 14**

A discussion with guest Peter Huggins, poet and instructor at Auburn University, about his book, *South*, with a poem which captures a historical event with African slaves who drowned off the Georgia coast, rather than serve in the US.

**-Broadcast on April 16:**

A discussion by phone with guest Daya Taylor, interim dean and associate professor in the Robert R. Taylor School of Architecture and Building Science at Tuskegee University, about the new Robert Taylor US postage stamp. Daya Taylor recapped the impact of Taylor's work on the design and construction of the Tuskegee campus, using students to teach them on site the principles of building science.

**-Broadcast on April 21:**

As on-location discussion at Confederate Memorial Park in Marbury, AL, with guest historian Bill Rambo, site director of the Alabama Historical Commission's park and museum, about the aftermath of the Civil War – taking care of wounded and homeless soldiers at the only Confederate Soldiers Home in Alabama. The museum seeks the public's help identifying pictures of nameless veterans. Two cemeteries are final resting places for the veterans who lived at the home.

**-Broadcast on April 26:**

An on-location tour of the Kelly Fitzpatrick Memorial Gallery in Wetumpka with guests Hope Brannon, curator, and Phyllis Kennedy, board member, to learn about paleo art in an exhibit that reflects the cataclysmic events of 85 million years ago, when an asteroid left a five-mile-wide marine impact crater that dramatically altered the landscape. The work of sculptor Larry Percy, Troy University professor of art and design, provided the entry point of the exhibit.

**-Broadcast on May 12:**

A 4-minute discussion with guest Martin Olliff, Troy University associate professor of history on the Dothan campus, about the Dothan exhibit of the Smithsonian's Museum on Main Street: *The Way We Worked*, a look at the economic building of the community – what made Dothan what it is today.

**-Broadcast on May 13:**

A discussion with Troy guest Sheila Jackson, who has portrayed music legend Ma Rainey of Columbus, GA, on stage. Jackson talked about Rainey's musical style, which led to her accolades as the Mother of the Blues.

**-Broadcast on May 19:**

A discussion with guest artist Paul Rusconi of Los Angeles about a special photograph his grandfather gave him - the Raising of the Flag at Iwo Jima, which has inspired Paul's works of recreated images on a glass canvas.

**-Broadcast on May 20:**

A discussion with guest writers Carole King and Karren Pell, self-described history sleuths, who discovered a previously unknown photograph of the Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr., with his family on the steps of the church he pastored on Dexter Avenue in Montgomery. After months of permission pursuits, the duo received approval to include the photograph in their forthcoming book on Montgomery.

**-Broadcast on May 25 Memorial Day:**

An on-location discussion at the home of Edward Stevens of Montgomery. Stevens is a WWII US Army veteran Tech Sergeant, who served with Patton's Third Army. In Europe, he was on hand for the liberation of prisoners at Buchenwald, and he still has nightmares about the starving people there.

**-Broadcast on June 2:**

A follow-up interview about the Smithsonian's Museum on Main Street project with guest historians John Kovach, the Alabama project director, and Martin Olliff, director of the Wiregrass Archives at Troy University Dothan. Kovach talked about the *Way We Worked* exhibitions as a tool for contextualizing how we work.

**-Broadcast on June 10:**

A discussion with guest historians Nimrod Frazer and Mark Wilson about World War I. Frazer funded a monument to the Alabamians of the Rainbow Division who fought in France, and he and Wilson will be part of the June 22<sup>nd</sup> WWI Symposium at the Alabama Department of Archives and History.

**-Broadcast on June 23:**

A discussion with guest Norman McGowin, MD, of Chapman and Greenville, AL, about publishing his late father's memoirs, *The Forest and the Trees*, which explores the McGowin's family lumber company and the old way of life in the company mill town of Chapman. Family owned timber companies have largely given way to giant corporations in the 21<sup>st</sup> century.
