

**FOURTH QUARTER ISSUES PROGRAMS LIST FOR
TROY UNIVERSITY PUBLIC RADIO
October 1 – December 31, 2014

Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community this quarter:

- A. Environmental Issues:** Coosa County Hiking Trail; Attracting winter hummingbirds to your yard.

- B. Societal Issues:** Uninsured people living with chronic health conditions; Personal debt; Social commentary about pictures on people's cell phones; Cyber genealogy and tracing family roots; Classical vocal arts training for young adults; Financial skills for tomorrow's workforce; Literary tourism; Establishing arts opportunities in east Alabama; the Affordable Health Care Act and changes in 2015; Saving financial documents; Political and civic issues for voters across the U.S. and in Alabama; Telemedicine's role in extending health care to rural areas; Telephone scams and seniors; Children in military families; Aiding the ability of visually impaired citizens to identify currency; International education efforts; Helping families who have lost children in death; Curbing holiday spending; Holiday safety tips for homeowners, travelers, and shoppers.

- C. Historical Issues:** Literary figure John Herrmann and the mystery of his life; *Gone with the Wind* and the movie's backstory; World War I's effect on the home front in Alabama; Alabama Dance Theatre young adult choreographer Sara Sanford and her interpretation of the historical and literary Dracula; Cooking in 19th century Alabama; Command Sergeant Major Bennie Adkins of Opelika and the Medal of Honor awarded for his heroic US Army service in Vietnam; Forgotten history of Alabama's capital city; Toomer's Oak – how art salvaged a symbol of Auburn history; Wakefield Plantation in Wilcox County; Family memories of the Civil War; F. Scott Fitzgerald's short stories; Cottage Hill, the oldest neighborhood in Montgomery; Radio dramas; Charles Dickens' creation of *A Christmas Carol*.

Section II: Responsive Programs

Broadcasts by the station dealt with programming on each of the above-referenced issues. Programming on *In Focus*, with host Carolyn Hutcherson, targeted each issue within a 9-minute time frame, between 12:06 and 12:30 p.m. weekdays. Note: the station also presented several programs created by independent producers, in observance of Native American Heritage Month in November.

A. Environmental Issues:

-Broadcast on Oct. 1:

An on-location discussion at the Hatchett Creek Trailhead with guests Kent Cooper of the Alabama Hiking Trail Society and Doug Deaton with the State Lands Division of the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, about the Coosa WMA Trail, its natural features, and its availability to citizens.

-Broadcast on Nov. 17:

A discussion with guest Fred Bassett, master bird bander and founder of the nonprofit Hummingbird Research.net organization, about techniques to attract wintering hummingbirds to your yard. Bassett reported on his summer trip to find the northernmost area where hummingbirds nest.

B. Societal & Health Issues:

-Broadcast on Oct. 6:

A discussion with guests Cynthia Bisbee, psychologist, and Ghandi Williams, social worker, both with the Montgomery Area Community Wellness Coalition, about the number of chronically ill people in Alabama without health insurance. The Oct. 9th Case Management Conference seeks to develop solutions.

-Broadcast on Oct. 6:

A four-minute discussion with guest Lynne Bozeman, CPA, about the problem of mounting personal debt, and ways to start managing it. Bozeman is a CPA Ambassador with the Alabama Society of Certified Public Accountants.

-Broadcast on Oct. 8:

A 12-minute discussion by phone from San Francisco with guest artist Ivan Cash, about his Last Photo Alabama Project, in which he interviewed people in central and east Alabama with the question, "What is the last photo you took on your cell phone?" The answers were a surprising compilation of what is important to people to visually document.

-Broadcast on Oct. 9:

A discussion with guest Nancy Dupree, research archivist with the Alabama Department of Archives and History, about how people can use cyber genealogy to trace their family roots. Recently Dupree's research was featured on the PBS program, "Finding Your Roots."

-Broadcast on Oct. 13:

A discussion with guests Metropolitan Opera Tenor David Cangelosi (by phone) and Maestro Thomas Hinds of the Montgomery Symphony Orchestra (in studio) about the Vann Vocal Institute's training of young adults in the classical vocal arts. A followup discussion with guests Carol Anne Osborne and Connor Murphy-White (by phone from Troy University in Troy). Osborne was last year's grand prize winner, and Murphy-White was a finalist in the Vann Vocal Institute competition.

-Broadcast on Oct. 13:

A four-minute discussion with guest John Olsen, FDIC Community Affairs Specialist, about the financial skills young adults will need in the workforce of the future.

-Broadcast on Oct. 14:

A discussion with guest Patrick Brian Miller about the potential of literary tourism. Miller developed the Southeastern Literary Tourism Initiative, which combines technology and literary travel, so that readers can preview the actual locations cited in books.

-Broadcast on Oct. 27:

A discussion with guests Virginia Transue, co-president of the Auburn Chamber Music Society, and Phillip Preston, executive director of the Arts Association of East Alabama, about the 50-year history of the two organizations, whose missions are to bring the cultural arts to east Alabama and develop arts opportunities for youth.

-Broadcast on Oct. 27:

A four-minute discussion with guest Sherri Jones, CPA, about changes in the health care law at the end of 2014 and what these changes mean to consumers. Jones is a member of the Alabama Society of Certified Public Accountants.

-Broadcast on Nov. 3:

A four-minute discussion with guest Lynne Bozeman, CPA, about how long consumers should keep financial documents. Bozeman is a CPA ambassador for the Alabama Society of Certified Public Accountants.

-Broadcast on Nov. 4:

A discussion by phone from Washington, D.C., with guest Nathalie Boyd, a producer for Decode DC, about how she monitors political races for the popular podcast. A follow up 4-minute discussion with guest contributor Don Dailey, host of Alabama Public Television's Capitol Journal, about key issues in the Alabama elections.

-Broadcast on Nov. 5:

A discussion with guest Dale Quinney, statistician in the Department of Primary Care for the Alabama Department of Public Health, about serving the needs of people in rural Alabama through Telemedicine.

-Broadcast on Nov. 10:

A discussion with guest David Smitherman, president and CEO of the Better Business Bureau of Central and South Alabama, about scammers who prey on senior citizens during the holidays, and especially by telephone.

-Broadcast on Nov. 11, Veterans Day:

Executive Producer Kyle Gassiott spoke by telephone with guest Kaveetha Cardoza, producer and host of the documentary, *Breaking Ground: Military Children*, for a 4-minute discussion of the lives and experiences of children of military veterans. The interview segment was broadcast during *Morning Edition* (7:33 a.m.) as a preview of the documentary this evening at 7 p.m.

-Broadcast on Nov. 19:

A discussion with Troy University Chancellor Jack Hawkins, Jr., about Troy's international programs and International Education Week. Hawkins recounted his first visit to Vietnam as a young Marine, then returned a generation later as an educator, to award more than 200 degrees in October during three commencement ceremonies in Vietnam. Troy University was the first American institution of higher learning to confer the baccalaureate degree to students in Vietnam in 2008.

-Broadcast on Nov. 20:

A discussion with guests Nancy Pack, director of the Alabama Public Library Service, and Ruth Evans, regional librarian for the Alabama Regional Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped, about 'currency readers' - talking devices that identify the denominations of bills for visually impaired people. Through a grant to the Library of Congress, visually impaired library patrons will receive a free currency reader (on a onetime basis).

-Broadcast on Nov. 24:

A discussion with guest Karen Storey, president of the Montgomery Chapter of Compassionate Friends, about the organization's mission to support grieving families whose children have died. Storey talked about the holidays and shared advice on ways to interact with those who have suffered the loss of a child.

-Broadcast on Nov. 24:

A four-minute discussion with guest John Olsen, FDIC Community Affairs Specialist, about ways to curb holiday spending before it gets out of control and leads to debt in January.

-Broadcast on Dec. 15:

A four-minute discussion with guest Derek Cunningham, chief deputy of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Department and sheriff-elect, about personal holiday safety and advice for homeowners, travelers, and shoppers.

C. Historical Issues:

-Broadcast on Oct. 2:

A discussion with guest Sara Kosiba, English professor at Troy University, about the disappearance of writer John Herrmann from the literary scene in the U.S. As a close friend of Ernest Hemmingway, Herrmann had published two novels by 1933, before he left for Mexico under suspicious circumstances as a Communist sympathizer.

Broadcast on Oct. 14:

A discussion with guests Sherri and Professor Bill Lipscomb, producer and actor in SEACT, the Southeast Alabama Community Theatre's production of *Moonlight and Magnolias*, which captures the behind-the-scenes chaotic story of how the *Gone with the Wind* movie was made.

-Broadcast on Oct. 28:

A discussion with guest historian Marty Olliff, associate professor of history at Troy University Dothan Campus and director of the Wiregrass Archives, about the 100-year anniversary of World War I, its effects on the Alabama home front, and its ultimate legacy of growth for the state. Olliff is the featured speaker at the Chambers County Library on Oct. 30.

-Broadcast on Oct. 29:

A discussion with guest Sara Sanford, young adult choreographer with the Alabama Dance Theatre, about her ballet interpretation of the historical and literary Dracula at the Alabama Shakespeare Festival.

-Broadcast on Nov. 6:

A discussion with guest Eleanor Cunningham, site director for the Alabama Historical Commission's Magnolia Grove in Greensboro, about nineteenth century cooking. Sally Hobson, the second owner of Magnolia Grove, collected recipes, and Cunningham shared several, as well as how meals were prepared in a kitchen in the 1800s.

-Broadcast on Nov. 11, Veterans Day:

An on-location discussion with guest Command Sergeant Major Bennie G. Adkins, US Army (Ret.), at his home in Opelika, about his Medal of Honor awarded by President Obama for heroic service in Special Forces during the Vietnam War in 1966. The mayor of Opelika has declared today Command Sergeant Major Bennie G. Adkins Day in Opelika.

-Broadcast on Nov. 25:

A discussion with guest Jeff Benton, historian and columnist with the *Montgomery Advertiser*, about published accounts of historical incidents in Alabama's capital city. Benton's new book is *Through Other's Eyes: Published Accounts of Montgomery, Alabama*.

-Broadcast on Nov. 26:

An on-location discussion at the Jule Collins Smith Museum of Art with guest Dennie Harper, curator, about how artist Matt Moulthrop salvaged a piece of Auburn history – Toomer's Oak, by sculpting a large bowl from the dying tree's trunk. The Toomer's Oak wooden bowl is displayed as part of the museum's collection.

-Broadcast on Dec. 8:

A discussion with guest Sharman Burson Ramsey about Wakefield Plantation, built in 1832 in Furman, Alabama. Her grandfather bought the home, with its unique Steamboat Gothic architecture, and Sharman reminisced about the foods from the garden that her grandmother prepared for the family. Ramsey is the author of several books of historical fiction.

-Broadcast on Dec. 9:

A discussion with guest Frye Gaillard, who was nine years old when his 100 year-old grandfather shared his memories of the Civil War. Gaillard's family is from Mobile, and his book, *Journey Through the Wilderness: War, Memory, and a Southern Family's Civil War Letters*, presents a vivid account of those times.

-Broadcast on Dec. 10:

Producer Katy Ganaway interviewed guest Willie Thompson, director of the F. Scott and Zelda Fitzgerald Museum in Montgomery, about F. Scott Fitzgerald's short stories, especially *A Luckless Santa Claus*, which Thompson will be reading during the museum's open house. Thompson pointed out that the Santa Claus story had elements in common to the rest of Fitzgerald's writing.

-Broadcast on Dec. 11:

An on-location discussion with guest Adam Whitley, whose neighborhood, Cottage Hill, is the oldest in Alabama's capital city. Whitley described the architectural styles in the historic district, the requirements residents must meet for exterior renovations, and the homes' typical interior construction – tall ceilings, heart pine floors, plaster walls, and fire places.

-Broadcast on Dec. 15:

A discussion with guest Greg Thornton, artistic director of the Cloverdale Playhouse in Montgomery, about the radio drama, *It's a Wonderful Life*, and how it differs from a typical stage play. Radio dramas in the 1930s and 40s used special sound effect techniques, as explored on Dec. 16 by Executive Producer Kyle Gassiott during his follow up visit to the theater. His guests were actors Alicia Ruth Jackson and Morgan Baker, and Joe Collins, the Foley artist who demonstrated several of the sound effects.

-Broadcast on Dec. 18:

An on-location discussion at the Alabama Shakespeare Festival with actors Rodney Clark and Winn Harmon about how Charles Dickens created *A Christmas Carol*, which was published in 1843. The actors also talked about the classic story's message and its relevance to today's audiences.
