**Section I. Issues.**

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community this quarter:

- A. Environmental Issues:** Alabama Gulf Coast; Apalachicola Maritime Museum's Paddlewheeler on the Chattahoochee River; Forever Wild Old Cahawba Prairie Tract; Seminole State Park in southeast Georgia.
  
- B. Societal Issues:** Strokes; Star ID Driver Licenses; White Canes; the Reshaping of the U.S. Population; Commercial Driver Licenses; Alabama's Business Enterprise Program for Blind Business Owners; Military Scholars Program; Higher Education and the Alabama Economy; Grief Resolution; Using the Arts to Keep Young People Engaged – a Rosa Parks Institute Project; Dementia and the StoryCorps Memory Project; Vivian B. Adams School for Developmentally Disabled Children and Adults in Ozark, AL; Moving Outside the U.S. to Serve Amazonian peoples; Cuban Arts and Holiday Traditions.
  
- C. Historical Issues:** 19<sup>th</sup> Century Montgomery; 1963 Birmingham Church Bombing Investigation; the Hallelujah Trail in Macon County; Zelda Fitzgerald's Years in a Psychiatric Hospital; Vietnam Veterans History Project in Florida; The Alabama State Capitol; Costume Arts; JFK's Visit to Tampa, Florida; The Little Bighorn Battlefield after Custer and the 7<sup>th</sup> Cavalry's Defeat; FDR and Thanksgiving at the Little White House in Warm Springs, Georgia; JFK and MLK; Battle of the Holy Ground.

**Section II: Responsive Programs.**

The station has broadcast programming dealing with each of the above-referenced issues. Programming on *Community Focus*, with host Carolyn Hutcheson, dealt with each issues in a 12-minute time frame, beginning at 12:10 p.m. Central time, each weekday.

**A. Environmental Issues:**

-Broadcast on Oct. 24:

A discussion with guest Mark Berte, Executive Director of the Alabama Coastal Foundation, about current efforts to educate citizens and school children about the ecological health of the Alabama Gulf Coast, which is recovering from the BP Oil Spill.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 1:**

A discussion by telephone with guest George Kirvin Floyd, Director and Chairman of the Board of the nonprofit Apalachicola Maritime Museum, about the paddlewheeler, *Jean Mary*, donated to the museum by actress Debbie Reynolds. The vessel will be used to introduce visitors to the ecology of Apalachicola Bay and the Chattahoochee River. He also talked about how the museum is teaching historical boatbuilding skills, to help the local economy.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 8:**

An on-location discussion with guests Chris Smith, State Lands Manager for the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, and Kenny Johnson, *Outdoor Alabama Magazine*, about the Forever Wild Prairie Tract near Old Cahawba Archaeological Park in Dallas County, Alabama. The tract hosts 625 species of flora on its 3,007 acres and has a trail system open to the public.

**-Broadcast on Dec. 11:**

A discussion by telephone with guests Clint Ralph, Seminole State Park Manager, and Katherine White, Assistant Manager, about the park's natural features and the project to restore the area's longleaf pine ecosystem. The park, operated by the Georgia Department of Natural Resources, is hosting a Tour of Lights and a Fitness Challenge.

## **B. Societal & Health Issues:**

**-Broadcast on Oct. 8:**

A discussion with guest Dr. John Campbell, Medical Director and Associate Southeast Alabama Regional EMS Director for Stroke and Trauma System Development for the Alabama Department of Public Health, about the new Alabama Southeast Regional Acute Stroke System, which provides expedited access to medical treatment for stroke victims.

**-Broadcast on Oct. 9:**

A on-location discussion at the Alabama Department of Public Safety with Captain Guy Rush, Assistant Division Chief of the Driver License Division, about Star ID Driver Licenses in Alabama. Star ID is a nationwide effort to improve the integrity and security of state-issued driver licenses, to help fight terrorism and reduce fraud. Georgia and Florida also are implementing Star ID.

**-Broadcast on Oct. 11:**

A discussion with guest Lenore Dillon, Coordinator of Rehabilitation Teaching and Orientation and Mobility Specialist for the Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services, about how vision-impaired people use white canes. She previewed Alabama's Inaugural White Cane Walk Oct. 19 in Birmingham.

**-Broadcast on Oct. 23:**

A discussion by telephone with guest Dr. Ilan Stavans, Professor in Latin American and Latino Culture at Amherst College, about what is quickly becoming *The United States of Mestizo*, the title of his book, and what the demographic trends will mean to the census takers.

**-Broadcast on Oct. 25:**

An on-location discussion at the Alabama Department of Public Safety with guest Corporal Brian Duke about the new medical requirements for Commercial Driver License holders.

**-Broadcast on Oct. 30:**

A discussion with guests Michael Talley, Birmingham business owner, and Ray Dennis, Director of the Business Enterprise Program for the Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services, about the 110 small businesses operated by blind business owners. The Alabama BEP Program promotes independence through self-employment.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 11, Veterans' Day:**

A discussion by telephone with guest Christina Dibble, Director of Programs for the Pat Tillman Foundation, about the Military Scholars Program, which pays for the college education of spouses of those killed while serving on military duty. The late Army Ranger Pat Tillman, who was killed in Afghanistan in 2004, had a passion for education.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 18:**

A discussion with guest Dr. Gregory Fitch, Executive Director of the Alabama Commission on Higher Education, about changes to Pell Grant requirements, financial incentives to make college affordable, and the role of higher education in workforce development for the Alabama economy.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 26:**

A discussion with guest Edie Malone of the Montgomery Chapter of Compassionate Friends about the organization's mission to support grieving families whose children have died. The annual Candlelight Ceremony of Remembrance will be held on Dec. 3. Families in grief are welcome at the chapter's monthly meetings.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 27:**

A discussion with guest Gwendolyn Thomas Kennedy, attorney and musician, about her 2014 musical project for young people, under the auspices of the Rosa and Raymond Parks Institute for Self-Development. From her perspective representing young people in the juvenile justice system, she shares advice on how to keep young people positively engaged by using the arts.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 29:**

A discussion by telephone with guest Dina Zempsky, Manager of the Memory Loss Initiative Mobile Tour for StoryCorps, about the organization's project to record oral histories of dementia patients before they lose all remembrance.

**-Broadcast on Dec. 4:**

A discussion by telephone with guests Hannah Parker, Director, and Susan Owens, School Resource Coordinator, about the Vivian B. Adams School for Developmentally Disabled Children and Adults in Ozark, AL. The challenge of meeting the needs in six counties has led the school to create sponsored scholarships, so that more children and adults can be served.

**-Broadcast on Dec. 10:**

A discussion by telephone with Gary Pate of Callahan, Florida, about his and wife Dena's upcoming move to the Amazon in Ecuador, where he will be Assistant Director of an orphanage for disabled children and Dena will serve as a nurse in a missionary hospital.

**-Broadcast on Dec. 12:**

A discussion with guest Dr. Adonis Gonzalez, Latin Grammy Award-winning pianist, about the emphasis on the arts in his native country of Cuba and its Latin holiday traditions.

### **C. Historical Issues:**

**-Broadcast on Oct. 10:**

A discussion with guest Jeff Benton, writer, about his research into antebellum Montgomery and the leisure pursuits of its citizens – theater, horse racing, opera, circus, dancing, gambling, and regimental support activities.

**Broadcast on Oct. 21:**

A discussion by telephone with guest Teresa Thorne, former Birmingham Police Captain, about the evidence found by investigators who sought justice after the Birmingham Church Bombing of 1963. She compiled the results of her years of research and interviews with the investigators into the book, *Last Chance for Justice: How Relentless Investigators Uncovered New Evidence Convicting the Birmingham Church Bombers*.

**-Broadcast on Oct. 29:**

A discussion with guest Dr. Michael Panhorst, Board member of the Alabama Trust for Historic Preservation, about the Lyceum Series and Car Caravan to historic religious places and spaces on the Hallelujah Trail in Macon County.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 5:**

A discussion with phone guest, writer Lee Smith, and studio guests Dr. Kirk Curnutt, Fitzgerald Scholar and Chair of the English Department at Troy University Montgomery Campus, and Dr. Sara Kosiba, organizer of the 12<sup>th</sup> International Fitzgerald Society Conference, about Zelda Fitzgerald's years of psychiatric treatment at North Carolina's Highland Hospital.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 12:**

A discussion by phone with Dr. Ben Brotemarkle, Executive Director of the Florida Historical Society, about the organization's Vietnam Veterans History Project, to preserve Florida veterans' recollections of their experiences in the Vietnam War.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 13:**

A discussion about the unique history of Alabama's State Capitol with guest historian Christy Carl, Site Director for the Alabama Historical Commission.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 14:**

A discussion by telephone with guest Arthur Oliver, resident designer for the Moscow Ballet, about the historical tradition of 200-piece costumes for *The Great Russian Nutcracker Ballet*.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 15:**

A discussion with guest host Kyle Gassiott, by telephone with guest Denis Calandra, who wrote the radio play, "Holy Matter," about President Kennedy's visit to Tampa, Florida, just days before his fateful trip to Dallas in 1963.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 20:**

A discussion by telephone with guest Rickard Ross of Billings, Montana, about his great-grandfather, Fred Server, one of the first soldiers to arrive at the Little Bighorn battlefield after Custer's defeat.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 21:**

A discussion with guest Brian Roslund, President of the Friends of Roosevelt's Little White House in Warm Springs, Ga., about FDR's family ties and humanitarian causes, as well as the national furor over "Franksgiving" in 1939.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 22:**

A discussion with guest sociologist Willy Leventhal, one of Martin Luther King's few white staff members in the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, about President Kennedy's relationship with King, in the context of the Birmingham Church bombing.

**-Broadcast on Nov. 25:**

**A discussion by phone with NPS historical re-enactor Steve Thomas of Ellijay, Ga., about the 1813 Battle of the Holy Ground, when American forces engaged Red Stick Creek Indians at a village on the Alabama River in Lowndes County. He previewed the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary re-enactment of the battle on Dec. 3, hosted by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.**
