IOLA PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Issues are addressed through two long form programs aired on a weekly basis and through regular coverage within local newscasts.

KIKS-KIOL produces local newscasts six days a week. Effective January 29th the number of daily newscasts was increased, with introduction of an additional morning newscast at 6:20 AM on KIOL and an additional newscast at 11:40 AM on KIKS. Other newscasts run in the 7 AM, Noon and 5 PM hours Monday through Friday, and on Saturday morning at 7:40 on KIKS. A sample of issues addressed in newscasts follows in this report.

The two long form programs are Radio Health Journal and Viewpoints Radio, which are heard Sunday mornings from 6-7 AM. Information on topics covered in these programs, which are 27 minutes in length, are attached.

IOLA NEWS FOR 1ST QUARTER 2024

SCHOOL SAFETY

1-2/1-3

Coverage of online threats against Southern Coffey County USD 245, which forced closure of the district's schools for three days while the threat was investigated. This included followup stories January 4th

3-8 and beyond

A series of stories dealing with a threat made against Yates Center High School that led to cancellation of classes there and increased security presence at a number of other area schools. In this case, three suspects were identified and later taken into custody after charges were filed, which was included in a follow-up story March 15th.

PUBLIC SAFETY

1-3

A story on restoration of online access and filing systems for the two judicial district taking in most of the counties in the listening area after a cyberattack on the Kansas Judicial Branch in October, 2023 that also shut down online payment systems for courts across the state.

1-8

Report on the setting of hearings by the Iola City Council on four structures that are considered unsafe and dangerous. Other stories on this were aired January 13^h and after the hearings were held in February. Although the exterior of the homes in question did not appear to be bad, interior conditions were something else

1-9/16

Various stories related to the impact of winter storms in the area, including school closings and delays, power outages for parts of the area and delays in delivery of area newspapers which are printed in locations more severely impacted. In the later part of the week this also focused on a polar airmass that would bring wind chills of -20 to the area. At this point additional announcement periods were added to provide updates on closings and other information and availability of warming stations, along with issues with water meter freeze-ups in Humboldt.

1-19

Information on emergency water conservation measures imposed by the City of Burlington and Coffey County Rural Water District 2 due to numerous water line breaks. The water district also serves customers in some adjoining counties.

1-27

A story on a visit by KC Wolf to Iola Elementary School as part of the school's DARE program graduation ceremony. KC Wolf, the mascot of the Kansas City Chiefs, frequently visits schools around the team's territory and shares some of his experiences over 35 years of being the team mascot.

1-29

A story on a program dealing with human trafficking organized by Allen Community College as part of National Human Trafficking Month, including what it is, the signs of it and prevention efforts.

1-30 and beyond

A series of stories on severe weather awareness programs put on by the National Weather Service. The reports outlined what is covered at the meetings, and dates and locations for sessions held in Iola, Chanute, Yates Center and Neodesha by the Wichita NWS office and in Burlington by the Topeka office.

2-17

A story on the Iola City Council's approval of an ordinance defining what constitutes a nuisance, dangerous or vicious dog. This ordinance had been under development for about a year, and there was concern about the definition of the word "Obnoxious" as it relates to this ordinance.

2-26

A story on the arrest of a Uniontown Junior High School Teacher after an incident where alleged "inappropriate touching" occurred in a setting outside the school environment and steps USD 235 took in the wake of the incident.

3-21

Coverage of a fatal fire at an apartment complex in Chanute. Two people died as a result of the fire that destroyed the Cornerstone Apartments, displacing some residents. Fire crews from Allen and Labette counties also responded to the fire, blamed on careless discard of smoking materials. Information was provided throughout the weekend on assistance being offered for fire victims and ways residents can help out including locations where donations can be brought.

3-26

Story on the arrest by Iola Police of a Nevada man in connection with a suspected human trafficking incident that was discovered when police were checking out a suspicious person that led to discovery of a missing person from Illinois. The man is also facing rape and other charges in this case.

HEALTH CARE

1-4

A story on the merger of two Health Care systems including St. Luke's Health System in Kansas City which operates Allen County Regional Hospital in Iola and Anderson County Residential Living Center in Garnett.

1-20

Information on a series of meetings being conducted by the Eastern Kansas VA Medical Center on a plan to open a new Community Based Outpatient Clinic in Iola, which would combine smaller clinics in Chanute, Fort Scott and Garnett into a larger facility offering more services.

2-21

A story on Ashley Clinic opening a new location in Iola. The Iola location will focus on both physical and mental health services, and the building on South Washington will also house a second physician group.

3-12

A story on a bill introduced by US Representative Jake LaTurner that would allow closed hospitals, such as one in Fort Scott, to reopen and apply for rural emergency hospital designation. This would allow for emergency and most outpatient services, and would expand eligibility by changing the requirements to be eligible for designation.

EDUCATION

1-10

A story on plans by Iola High School for a College and Career Fair February 1st that will expose students to the various college and career options available to them along with a number of breakout sessions.

1-13

Story on the naming of Humboldt High School Family and Consumer Science Teacher Jodee Nickell as recipient of a 2024 Horizon Award from the Kansas State Department of Education, recognizing outstanding first year teachers in Kansas.

1-24

Story on Crest USD 479's interview of representatives from four firms to serve as construction manager-at-risk for projects voters had authorized in November, 2023. Followup stories were aired the week of January 29th after the CMAR was selected.

2-10

A story on the hiring of Dr. Ryan Most as superintendent of Garnett USD 365. Dr. Most will be succeeding Don Blome, who is retiring at the end of the school year.

2-19

Story on Allen Community College Trustees' decision to revise tuition payment policies. An uproar developed late last year over requirements international students pay tuition in full at the start of the semester rather than in

installments, adopting a plan that will allow those payments to be made using a third party vendor.

QUALITY OF LIFE

1-11

A story on a decision by the lola City Council to submit two proposals to the community for their views on a city flag for lola. Additional stories aired during February and March on the voting process and results of the vote, which led to adoption of the selected flag that is based on the clock tower of the one-time Allen County Courthouse torn down in 1959 to construct the present courthouse.

1-31

A story on a Black History Month program at Neosho County Community College in Chanute about civil rights leader Gordon Parks, who grew up in nearby Fort Scott.

2-8

A story on a Community Conversation in Carlyle held by Thrive Allen County as part of a series of such session held in communities in the county. A couple of issues were raised during this session including speed issues on the main street through the town, which would later be taken up by the Allen County Commission.

2-20

A story on the Southeast Kansas Museum Alliance's 2024 Museum Passport Program. This involves 49 museums around southeast Kansas, an expansion from past years, and includes information on each museum.

3-6

Story on Women's History Month and a program hosted by the lola Public Library on Osa Johnson, the famed writer, photographer, filmmaker and explorer who along with her husband Martin (from Chanute) documented the wildernesses of Kenya, the Congo, British North Borneo and the Solomon and New Hebrides Islands, including tribal customs that no longer exist.

3-29

A story on fundraisers organized by the lola Fire Department and lola Elks Lodge to assist Assistant Fire Chief Eric B'Hymer, who was diagnosed in February with non-small lung cancer. The fundraisers included a pancake breakfast and cornhole tournament organized by the Fire Department and a supper organized by the Elks.

RECYCLING

1-24 and beyond

A story on discussion about recycling options for the lola area following the closure of a volunteer-run recycling center. The lola City Council looked at a number of options ranging from setting up a city-run recycling utility to arranging for drop-off bins. The first option would have involved a doubling of monthly trash charges.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

1-31

Story on Allen and Neosho Counties and their respective economic development entities on the Growing Rural Businesses program being brought to Chanute and lola in March and April.

2-2 (also environment) A story on Evergy and Monarch Cement Company partnering on a 20 megawatt solar array at their Humboldt Plant that will offset a significant part of the company's energy production.

3-28

A story on possible changes to transient vendor license regulations in lola. The discussion came about due to concerns about the limited licensing options lola has compared to other communities, and the fact some "brick and mortar" businesses in lola have to get transient licenses because they offer mobile services, and one case where a license is required because a business building is in axles due to being located in a flood plain.

GOVERNMENT ISSUES

2-2 and beyond

A series of stories dealing with February utility billings for several cities not showing up. This occurred in Humboldt, Yates Center and Garnett where the entire utility billing for the month was held up for some time at a mail processing center in Kansas City that has come under intense scrutiny over mail being delayed for extended periods of time. In Garnett, this led to the City Commission waiving late fees for all utility customers for

February, and in Iowa the City decided to change from postcard bills to bills in an envelope, which it appears doesn't have the problems postcard bills had for them in the recent past. Similar action was taken later in the month in Humboldt.

A story on a student from Allen Community College being the winner of Kansas Farm Bureau's Collegiate Discussion Meet. Adrian Yoho qualified for national competition and an all-expenses paid trip to the American Farm Bureau Federation's YF&R Leadership Conference in Omaha.
