ISSUES OF CONCERN TO CINCINNATI ADDRESSED IN RESPONSIVE PROGRAMMING THE SECOND QUARTER, 2015

- 1. <u>Parenting A Special Needs Child:</u> We discussed the challenges of raising a child with special needs.
- Organ and Tissue Donation: More than 3, 000 Ohioans are waiting for a life-saving transplant at any given time. One Ohioan dies every other day waiting for a life-saving transplant. We presented information to educate listeners about organ and tissue donation.
- 3. <u>Foster Care:</u> A countless number of children languish in the foster care system each year in this country. We presented information to help improve the quality of life for those young people who are often abused and neglected
- 4. Health: We supplied information designed to help maintain a sound mind and body.
- 5. <u>**Parenting:**</u> We provided information to help parents improve their parenting skills and ultimately strengthen their bond with their children.
- 6. <u>Finance:</u> We provided information to help families improve their finances—including establishing a budget. We also discussed the impact that money has on marriage. We provided tips and information to help both preschoolers and teenagers understand and respect money
- 7. <u>Race Relations:</u> We presented information to bring a better appreciation of the culture of those of a different race, heritage or socioeconomic background.

After years of being addicted to crack cocaine, Hoskins joined us to share her story. Since her release, Hoskins has turned her life around. She is a licensed clinical addiction counselor and has earned three college degrees. She also heads a program that is a national model for ex-offender services. Sasha says there are sanctions and restrictions imposed on people with criminal records long after they complete all the terms of their sentences. She explained that there are over 800 Ohio laws which limit access to employment, housing, education, professional licensing, family relationships, civic participation and recreation.
