ISSUES OF CONCERN TO CINCINNATI ADDRESSED IN RESPONSIVE PROGRAMMING THE FIRST QUARTER, 2015

- 1. <u>Learning Disabilities:</u> Fifteen percent of the U.S. population, or one in seven Americans, has some type of learning disability, according to the National Institutes of Health. During first quarter 2015, we focused on children and learning disabilities.
- 2. **Employment:** We provided useful tips and information to assist those that are currently searching for employment.
- 3. **Health:** We supplied information designed to help maintain a sound mind and body.
- 4. **Race Relations:** We presented information to bring a better appreciation of the culture of those of a different race, heritage or socioeconomic background. We also explored the struggle for civil rights both nationally and internationally.
- 5. <u>Literacy:</u> Educators nationwide maintain that the country is facing a literacy crisis. We spoke to authors and experts who presented information to engage young people in reading.
- 6. <u>Homelessness:</u> We examined the state of homelessness in Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky. We focused on the dangers homeless individuals face on a daily basis, the impact homelessness has on children, and services available to the city's homeless population.

- 8. <u>Human Trafficking:</u> We focused on world-wide efforts to end commercial sexual exploitation of women sold into trade and are victims of human trafficking.

Dr. McElroy is one of the world's top researchers in the field of bipolar disorder. She spoke on-air about the implications of this exciting new data.
