

# 1ST QUARTER 2021/ FCC ISSUES REPORT

KTIC AM/FM West Point, Nebraska  
FCC 1st Quarter Issues  
January/February/March 2021

---

West Point, Nebraskas' KTIC AM 840 and 107.9 FM were very focused on two, large community and area concerns during the first quarter of 2021:

1. The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, and the early stages of vaccinations which started in March.

Both stations carried daily information provided by Elkhorn Logan Valley Public Health Department in newscasts, PSA's and interviews. This was supplemented by national information from the CDC and area hospitals, including West Point.

Area health care professionals and some teachers were inoculated earlier than that. Then, middle aged and elderly citizens were getting shots.

The coronavirus cases began to level off in February , only to begin increasing again in late March.

Vaccinations had opened up for area residents age 18 and older in West Point and neighboring towns as of March 26th.

KTIC AM/FM broadcast this and other daily information regarding the pandemic and the vaccines during the 1st quarter, as well as on social media and our website.

2. A series of record-setting winter storms which threatened the well-being of local and area residents. This included a mid-February blast of

Arctic air which plunged temperatures to 30 below zero and caused rolling power outages in our communities. Wind-chills were at -55 at times.

In addition to the above two issues, KTIC and The Bull addressed other West Point issues including:

- The ongoing progress of water quality in the community.
- Business
- Education
- Agriculture
- Health
- Local Government

KTIC-AM addresses the economic impact of Agriculture daily, as this is the primary industry. We have daily reports at 10-minutes past each hour and additional updates at 4-past, along with numerous features every hour.

KTIC provides two local news updates hourly, along with CBS Radio world news, which became even more vital during the pandemic.

FM 107.9 KTIC provides similar Agriculture and local news reports hourly.

### Community Involvement

KTIC General Manager Dwight Lane continues to serve on the Board of Directors for the West Point Chamber of Commerce.

This gives the radio stations perspective in being able to better understand and react to the needs of local businesses, especially during the pandemic.

Many KTIC staff are involved in various community organizations.

Tammie Harrington is a volunteer with the Cuming County Area Relay for Life, which benefits the American Cancer Society.

We currently have two volunteers who are youth mentors in the TeamMates Program, established by former Nebraska football coach , Dr. Tom Osborne.

Along with issues KTIC AM/FM addressed, they were also covered on our KTIC Translators, FM 98.3 in West Point and 98.7FM in Norfolk.

We also addressed winter weather challenges in the Norfolk area via KTIC AM Translator FM 98.7.

All of our guests and interviews were posted as podcasts on our website, KTIC [radio.com](http://radio.com). Our social media was also included in daily updates on the pressing challenges of COVID-19 and winter storms.
