Topic: Famous jazz musician Chris Brubeck from the band “Triple Play” discusses his upcoming concert in Bemidji that will benefit the Bemidji Symphony Orchestra. Brubeck is a composer and a one-time collaborator with the BSO. Brubeck is the son of Dave Brubeck, another famous jazz musician, and has a long musical history.

“Community Spotlight Program”—Air Date 3/3/19

Topic: Shawn Carter, from Bemidji Baptist Church, discusses “Reformers Unanimous,” a faith-based addiction program. Carter is an elder of the church, and discusses the addiction program, which is sanctioned by the court system. The program includes child care during the meetings.

“Living United Podcast”—Air Date 3/10/19

Topic: Kev Jackson and United Way Executive Director Danae Alamano host a podcast with director of Adult Day Services April Coleman in Bemidji. Adult Day Services promotes healthy aging, with a focus to enhance overall wellness, and gives socializing, therapeutic services and assistance with personal care needs for aging adults. The center is licensed to provide care for 18 and older, with 50 percent veterans utilizing the program.

D. WOMEN’S ISSUES

“Community Spotlight Program”—Air Date 3/17/19

Topic: Advocate Erin Schneider from the Northwoods Battered Women’s Shelter discusses “Action Day,” an awareness campaign on domestic violence. A recent double homicide and suicide in Nary has been linked to domestic violence, as was a homicide in Red Lake. Action Day is where people in the community come together to rally to bring attention to domestic violence. Erin talks about the needs of the shelter as well, with many people seeking help were turned away due to a lack of space.

E. YOUTH HEALTH AND WELL-BEING

“Community Spotlight Program”—Air Date 3/24/19

Topic: Joanna Wallenberg and Rosie Germstahd discuss the ACES summit held last month in Park Rapids. Wallenberg reviews ACE’s, or adverse childhood

experiences. They can affect physical health as well as mental health. ACEs can be one of 10 items, physical abuse, physical neglect, sexual abuse, and a category of household dysfunction, such as parental substance use, parent with mental illness, violence in the home, divorce, and a member of the household incarcerated. Also discussed was positive stress, tolerable stress such as poverty, even some of the ACEs, and intolerable, toxic stress that usually results in ACEs. Wallenberg and Germstahd also other projects they work on, such as a mentor program for at-risk children.

“Living United Podcast”—Air Date 1/6/19

Topic: Kev Jackson and United Way Executive Director Danae Alamando host a podcast and discuss Peacemaker Resources with Stacy Berder-Fayette. The local nonprofit has been in Bemidji for 20 years and focus on healthy communities and healthy families. They focus on education in three areas, such as social-emotional learning, trauma informed learning and cultural responsiveness. Peacemaker Resources works with schools and young children in learning some of these skills.

Topic: Kev Jackson and United Way Executive Director Danae Alamano host a podcast with director of the Boys and Girls Club of the Bemidji Area Andrea Ohnstad. The club has been in town for sixteen years and occupies a former building of the old Bemidji High School. The club has served 3,500 children in that time, and serves 600 each year and 200 each day.
