#### Section I. Issues

Each station has identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. COVID 19 Pandemic:** The United States and the rest of the globe continues to navigate the world in the Post-COVID Era, and Wyoming is no different. We interviewed officials ranging from local doctors to the state public health officer. Programming included interviews and press conference from local and state leaders regarding a rollout of the vaccine, lifting of health orders and otherwise the “return to normalcy.”
- B. Wildfire in Wyoming:** As summer turns to spring, officials are anticipating a potentially rough wildfire season on the state’s public lands. Programming included state forester Bill Crasper joining Glenn Woods to discuss the upcoming fire season along with Governor Mark Gordon and state forestry officials addressing the state before the season got underway.
- C. National Issues/Local Perspective:** Various Wyoming officials from members of congress to local pundits were featured in programming discussing everything from their take on the Biden administration to Rep. Liz Cheney’s vote to impeach former President Donald Trump.
- D. Wyoming’s Economy Recovers:** Wyoming has already cut its budget by 10% — and more are coming. This is due to the state’s reliance on the extraction industries, which took severe hits as demand for electricity and gasoline plummeted amid the pandemic. Programming included airing Governor Mark Gordon’s addresses to the state’s citizens. We also had guests on our shows to distill the situation to listeners.
- E. Local Government Issues:** Despite there being an ongoing pandemic, local governments in Wyoming continued to operate. Throughout the quarter, our stations covered how governments are dealing with the pandemic and how they are handling revenue shortfalls. Other major local government issues included wrestling with budget cuts as the state’s revenue has taken a major hit. Casper City Council discussed economic development issues and other issues that shouldn’t be taken as benign at face value such as parking.

Particularly, the group was concerned about the permitting process for the ride, which raises motorcycle safety awareness, and the police department’s handling of the situation.
