Seg 1 – Courtney Cole reports on student mental health challenges.

Interviews: Mia Holloway, 17, a DCPS student; Ally Boatwright, a UNF student; Dr. Andrew King, Baptist Behavioral Health. Students whine about how "hard" and "sad" it is being quarantined and not seeing their friends or classmates regularly. Dr. King confirms it's socially alienating, but advises kids need to toughen up and deal with it because distance is the new normal.

Seg 2 – Tenikka Hughes reports on the impact of Covid-19 on very young children. Studies reported by "Nature" magazine supported that covid affects juvenile brains, resulting in impaired motor skills and cognitive abilities, a condition called the "Pandemic Dip."

Interviews: Elaine Petry, daughter Elan had cognitive/processing issuesMedical and academic assessments with the Brain Balance Center in Bartram Park, in conjunction with therapies, helped Elan recover from impairments. She is now participating in regular 1<sup>st</sup> grade classes.

Seg 3 – Jake Stofan reports on the rapidly growing need for resources handling inpatient behavioral health in the wake of Covid-19.

Interviews: Michael Aubin, Wolfson Children's Hospital; Eileen Briggs, Chief Development Officer at Sulzbacher; Melanie Brown-Woofter, Florida Behavioral Health Association; Dr. Vicki Waytowich Executive Director for Partnership of Child Health. The frequency of juvenile outpatient mental health visits is up +200%, meaning it can take months to get an appointment. Also, there are limits on the amount of available beds, programs, and services. On top of that, there are a limited number of available professionals, limited resources to hire more, and because mental health is compensated differently by insurance, hospitals often eat the cost for outpatient mental health, so hospitals limit their liability.

Seg 4 – Meghan Moriarty reports on a student lead middle school club in Douglas Anderson that is improving mental health among students.

Interviews: Kathy Anderson, Douglas Anderson School Counselor; Cynthia Jackson, student. Students at DA developed a "support group" for coping with Covid-19 isolation. She tells us that while she was isolated with her family during Covid-19 the club allowed her an alternative way to meet and socialize with others.
