Rutherford commends Florida's Red Flag Laws and speaks to the national application of similar legislation. Rutherford speaks to the importance of threat assessment of gun owners and education of the public on how to identify potential active shooters over gun restrictions. He further illustrates the need to "focus on the person and behavior, not the gun" and the importance of due process when orchestrating Red Flag legislation.

**Segment** - Amid talks of District 6 Congressman Mike Waltz speaks on Congressman John Rutherford's efforts to maintain the right of law-abiding citizens to retain ownership of their firearms and Fix Nics. Walsh emphasizes to importance of keeping guns out of the hands of mentally ill and the due process that ultimately makes that call. In ref to the due process of Gun Show loopholes, Walsh errs on the side of caution, referring to guns as the symptom, not the problem. He introduces the idea of voluntary "National Service" in an effort to curb youth violence with community involvement. When asked about democratic efforts to remove certain types of guns from the hands of American citizens, Walsh makes clear that his view of the second amendment is that it is "not a lesser amendment" and should be protected.

**Segment** - Expresses concern about the amount of time it takes Hurricane relief funds to reach those in need, citing a Volusia County community that just received financial aid 2008's Hurricane Fay. Calling for common sense solutions, Walsh looks to improve the speed of this aid by reevaluating the bureaucracy that slows the process. In addition to these evaluations, Walsh speaks to Gov DeSantis's efforts to curb the washout caused by storm surges. A member of the Armed Services Committee, Walsh speaks to his concern with the diversion of Military funding to fund the border wall. Though he doesn't believe these funds should be diverted, he feels the president has little choice. Walsh also brushes off the jokes surrounding Trumps Space Force, saying that it will be just as interictal to the 21<sup>st</sup> century as the Airforce was to the 20<sup>th</sup>.
