Summary: In this episode, I talked with Clay County Supervisor of Elections Chris Chambless about what people need to keep in mind ahead of election day. He says early voting turnout so far has been record breaking. In order to save time at the polls, he says bring a sample ballot filled out, so you can transfer your choices over to your actual ballot and you'll need to bring an ID. He says you can also drop off your mail-in-ballot at early voting locations during the early voting period. He says ballots are processed in a public setting and anyone can view them do it. He says after the early voting period they will take the equipment back to the Supervisor's of Elections Office and begin to process the votes. On Election day at 7PM are likely going to be all of the early voting ballots and all the mail-in-ballots that have been processed so far. He says in Florida one-half of one percent will trigger a machine recount in a race and one-quarter of one percent triggers a manual recount. He says there has been a lot of noise about the election this year in terms of interference and he says don't let misinformation or disinformation keep you from voting.

She says during the holiday season Hubbard House sees many different needs for those that come in. She says they are looking for basic supplies and toys for children. She says they are in need of unwrapped presents for parents and children, so each group can pick out a gift and give it to their mom or dad or their children. She says these gifts give survivors hope and show them that someone is out there thinking about them. She told a story that someone who received help from Hubbard House over 15 years ago still holds onto the same gifts because it reminded her that she wasn't alone.
