EPA's Office of Inspector General announced its pending probe in a letter sent Wednesday to senior officials at the agency.

The letter says the review will examine whether EPA adequately protected human health and water resources in the regions affected by hurricanes Harvey, Irma and Maria. The notice says the inspector general's goal is to help the agency better plan and respond to future hurricanes.

The letter did not say how long the review might take.

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement has just released new data, showing overall crime for the first half of 2017, was actually down when compared to the same time last year. The FDLE's 2017 Semi-Annual Uniform Crime Report shows the state's crime, both violent and property related, dropped by two percent. The report shows murder, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, and larceny were all down. However, rape and motor vehicle theft were actually up. It also shows domestic violence fell, but stalking was on the rise. Taking a look at Northeast Florida, the overall downward crime trend didn't necessarily hold. St. Johns County and Duval County actually both saw increases in crime in this new report. Both showed a 0.4% increase in crime, when compared to the same time period last year. Meanwhile, Nassau County and Baker County saw dramatic decreases in crime, outpacing the state. In Nassau, crime was down 5.8%, while Baker saw a 3.9% decrease. As for Clay County, they seemed to be closest to the state trend, with a 2.4% decrease in crime in the first half of this year. Speaking about the overall report, the FDLE Commissioner, Rick Swearingen, released the following statement, "Every day across Florida, law enforcement officers at the state, local, and federal levels work together to keep Florida citizens safe. Because of our partnerships Florida's citizens and visitors are the safest they've been in more than 46 years."
