Common Core or Florida Standards is a uniform way of teaching students throughout the nation. The start of Common Core goes back to the 1980's under President Reagan and most states adopted this by 2011. Under this same topic is No Child Left Behind which also includes Class Size. Dr. Vitti says No Child Left Behind is about accountability but Common Core is about the standards of learning. However, No Child Left Behind came before Common Core and he says that was putting the cart before the horse.

Vitti says the FCAT has gone away but now there's the Florida State Assessment. He outlines changes to the test which includes more writing and more depth. He also says there's a better integration of subject areas. He says the greatest change is in math and teaching concepts instead of memorization.

This edition of First Coast Forum we're discussing Medicaid, Medicaid expansion, and how it affects the community with Darryl Shell of Intuitive Networking, a mental health case management company. Medicaid is jointly funded effort by the state and federal government to provide coverage for low-income children/some of their parents, poor pregnant women, certain low-income seniors, and some individuals with disabilities who are under the age of 65, it is Darryl's job to help link his clients to resources that help them reach their goals. Those goals require Darryl to find a myriad of things ranging from medical facilities to additional assistance in

schools for disabled children. The expansion of Medicaid presents a unique challenges for case managers, although it provides coverage for larger groups of people now many medical facilities are reluctant if not opposed to accepting Medicaid.

Oncologists and cardiologists are two of the specialists that offer up their services. We Care Jacksonville contacts physicians to donate healthcare. They have 600 healthcare providers and 10 clinics in their network of services but they need more physicians.

Bryan says about 120,000 are uninsured in Jacksonville.

In the second half of HOT Topics Julie is joined by the president of the Duval County Medical Society, Dr. Mobeen Rathore. Rathore says there's a need to educate families and the community so it's a multi-prong approach to healthcare. The most important thing to focus on is preventive care so there's less cost down the road.

Dr. Guns speaks on the reasons why we might be seeing an increase in crime- He implies that there is a breakdown in the family unit and perhaps a negative image in the nation with regard to law enforcement. Brian Surtecky from OSHA was also a guest on the show and spoke about the increase incidences of safety mishaps on NE Florida Job sites. He goes on the discuss the lack of accountability among contractors and an increase in electrocutions, falls and hit-by incidents. Our final guest was Elaine Spencer, Chief of housing and Community Development for the City of Jacksonville. Ms. Spencer surmises the Renew Jax initiative proposed by Mayor Alvin Brown and is now being implemented to fight urban blight especially in north and southeast Jacksonville.

Topics: Creating a city budget that reflects Mayor-elect Curry’s campaign promises and values by building a city budget “from the ground up”. A thorough review of city finances will be conducted. Curry says he will work with the Sheriff to make sure he has the resources he needs for enforcement and prevention of crimes, and he will work with community, business and religious leaders for prevention and intervention, especially with children. Curry plans to have a close relationship with state lawmakers in Tallahassee to ensure that our tax dollars come back to benefit the city, as demonstrated by his recent trip to the State Capitol that resulted in a \$250,000 grant for the city to hire more police officers.

Curry says he will evaluate Shad Khan’s plan to develop the shipyards like he would any other plan to make sure it is the best fit for the area. Curry says that the key to getting downtown to “flourish” is to “cut the private sector loose” and make it easier for them to do the things they want to do in the area.

Curry says he has talked to every member of the city council and is working on building trust with them so that the city officials can be unified.

Downtown Investment Authority CEO Aundra Wallace says he has met with Mayor-elect Curry already and the working relationship with his administration is off to a good start.

Wallace says they are in the process of negotiating with Shad Khan's team about the proposal for developing the shipyards, and they are carefully considering sources to assist with the cost of the project, including public funds. They are also now considering the public input to design options for the Jacksonville Landing area. They have already hired an urban design company and have developed a process for getting input and designing the project.

Wallace says the Laura Street Trio financier is looking for funding to develop the Barnett Bank building. He says they have worked hard on marketing for the downtown entertainment district with banners and the new website and it has already started paying off for the city. He is excited about the opportunities ahead for downtown Jacksonville.
