Tallahassee, FL - As court battles continue about whether the state is properly carrying out a 2016 constitutional amendment that broadly legalized medical marijuana, the Florida House is again trying to weigh in.

House attorneys Friday gave notice that they will appeal a Leon County circuit judge's ruling that blocked the House from intervening in a lawsuit to help defend a controversial 2017 law that was designed to carry out the constitutional amendment. The move came as the House also is asking the 1st District Court of Appeal to allow it to intervene in another case about the 2017 law.

The notice filed Friday, as is common, does not detail the House's arguments. But it seeks to overturn a decision last month by Leon County Circuit Judge Charles Dodson that kept the House out of a lawsuit filed by Patients and Producers Alliance, Inc. against the Florida Department of Health.

The non-profit Patients and Producers Alliance argues in the lawsuit that the 2017 law violates the constitutional amendment because it improperly restricts medical-marijuana firms. The House has contended in circuit court that it should be allowed to defend the law, in part pointing to the state's need to navigate federal laws, under which marijuana remains illegal.

"The Florida House of Representatives, as one-half of the state's policymaking branch, is well-situated to respond to the plaintiff and the court in defense of (the 2017 law)," the House said in a January filing in circuit court. "Notably, the MMA (medical marijuana amendment) gives implementation authority --- not policymaking authority --- to the Department of Health, and the Florida Constitution's strict, express separation of powers precludes this court from exercising policymaking authority. That leaves the Legislature with the sole constitutional authority to make the necessary policy choices for how to implement the MMA within the limits of an otherwise conflicting and superseding federal drug policy."

A local neurologist is suing Carnival Cruise lines for using property stolen from his family over 60 years ago. He was not allowed to take any of his personal belongings when he was forced out of his property; a business that was in the family since 1905. The owners have been waiting decades to sue over use of their land. Title III is being criticized but it reflects the intent of international law that prohibits confiscation of property without fair compensation. Settling the claims are crucial in order to reconcile between the US and Cuba.

A local mother died behind bars. Medical treatment in the Clay County jail may have played a role in the death. She died alone in a jail cell on March 4th of hypertensive heart disease and chronic drug withdrawal. Several drugs were found in her system. Clay County Jail Director spoke on the incident. Staff was informed that she may have had drugs in her system at the tie she was booked. Cameras in the jail do not record; many are broken. The system is antiquated and need to be replaced. Looking to improve services by using a third party provider to screen and treat inmates. This will potentially impact the tax payers in Clay County.

Toll roads opening this weekend after taxpayers fought to get rid of them. The cost to print and mail the tickets is far more than the cost of the tickets themselves; a misuse of tax dollars. Rob Bradley spoke to reporters regarding Sunpass refusing to speak on the toll tax and fees. Audrey Gibson spoke on the marketing and advertising for Sunpass.

This week's program focused on the issues affecting active duty and retired veterans in our area. Throughout the program, several aspects of military life were reported on to include, combat latoral ships, women in the armed services, VA disability claims and how veterans are coping with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Jacksonville is currently the home of eight combat littoral ships and over the next several years six additional ships are slated to be permanently home ported at Naval station Mayport. Naval Station Mayport also housed a \$30 million dollar combat ship simulator used to train sailors, one of only three in the country. Women currently make up 17% of the armed services; the Department of Defense has made efforts and is continually seeking ways of expanding opportunities to women in the military. The VA disability claim process can take anywhere from 3-7 years to complete. Policy at the Veteran's Administration is being revised to streamline the process to a year or less to include recourse for service members should a claim be disapproved. Finally, the program concluded with a package on Post Traumatic Disorder (PTSD) and how veterans have been comping. Some of those comping mechanisms include the use of service dogs, counseling and peer-to-peer activities.
