*Broken Record Radio Show (BRRS): (English), Monday 9:00 pm – 11:00 pm The Broken Record Radio Show is a weekly 2-hour radio talk show about politics and current events.

*Caminos Indígenas: (Spanish), Sunday 3:00 pm – 5:00 pm

This program focuses on informing immigrant farmers and farm workers about labor rights, housing, education, immigration, health, etc., combined with the culture, music and poetry of Oaxaca, Guerrero, Maya, and Yucatan.

*Caminos Músicales: (Spanish), Thursday, 9:00 -11:00 pm

Share music of the coast of Oaxaca and Guerrero. At the same time, present local information of the Latino community of the county.

*Compartiendo y Aprendiendo: (Spanish), Friday 4:00 pm – 6:00 pm

Compartiendo y Aprendiendo is a live, two-hour Spanish language original public affairs program that airs weekly and discusses local, national and international news items. The purpose of the program is to inform and inspire Latina housewives to help them get involved in their community.

*Duke and Banner: (English), Friday 10:00 pm - 1:00 amNews headlines, commentary and music.

*Entre Mundos: (Spanish), Wednesday 9:00 am – 10:00 am

The idea of this program is a review of men's personal development in spiritual and ecological ways.

*Informe KBBF: (Spanish), Friday 6:00 pm - 8:00 pm

Informe KBBF is a live, two-hour Spanish language original public affairs program that airs weekly and discusses local, national and international news items. Informe also features interviews with experts as well as audience participation via call-ins.

Invítame a Tu Tierra: (Spanish) Tuesday 5:00 pm – 6:00 pm

This program focuses on the food, culture, music from different countries. The program conducts book reviews that are Latino oriented. The attempt is to increase the habit of reading amongst the Latino communities in the area.

KBBF Boletín de Noticias: (Bilingual Spanish, English) A 3 minute news bulletin, produced 3 times a week, airing at various times throughout the day.

*La Voz Chicana (Bilingual), Saturday 11:00 am - 1:00 pm

Talk/Music: information about education, culture, immigration, and community affairs.

*Lideres del Futuro: (Bilingual), Thursday 5:00 pm – 7:00 pm

This program focuses on education, immigration, politics, mental health and how these issues affect our community. The guests for the show include local and national organizations and authors.

*Nuestra Tierra (Spanish), Monday 9:00 am – 10:00 am

Nuestra Tierra/Our Earth is a one-hour radio show that serves as a resource hub that provides a voice for different environmental topics to educate and inform the Spanish-language audience in Sonoma County and surrounding areas where KBBF's signal is broadcast. This show provides the opportunity to highlight the services and availability of resources from multiple agencies in the same region; which include water agencies, waste management agencies, sanitation districts, and storm water programs. Overall, these agencies play a big part in keeping our local environment, clean, sustainable, and safe.

The program also provides answers to questions that listeners might have, but that for some reason are afraid to ask. In the process, the program also clarifies and dissipates any misunderstandings that the listeners might have. It also provides the listeners with a topic of conversation that they could use at home, work and basically anywhere.

*Opciones de Vida: (Spanish), Saturday 6:00 am – 8:00 am

The idea of this program is a review of men's personal development in spiritual and ecological ways.

*Planeando Hoy su Mañana (Spanish), Wednesday 6:00 pm – 7:00 pm Information about personal finance, including such topics as saving, retirement, banking, investing, credit, insurance, financial security, and how to maintain financial independence.

*Punto de Vista (Spanish), Saturday 9:00 am – 11:00 am

This show began in 2005 under the name "Entre Amigos", later changed to "Amigos en Linea", and from 2012 it changed to the concept as it is today. The focus is a Saturday magazine with news summaries, ecology topics, history, technology, motivation. At the same time it includes interviews and selected music.

*Radio Autóctona Indigenista: (Trilingual: Spanish, Trique, Mixteco), Tuesday 6:00 pm -7:00 pm. This program addresses cultural aspects of the Indigenous cultures of the state of Oaxaca, Mexico.

*Roseland Report (Bilingual), Wednesday 4:00 pm -6:00 pm

News, music, and interviews: this program thrives to conduct interviews with the local Latino leaders in their communities.

*Simple-Mente (Spanish), Thursday 7:00 pm – 8:00 pm

Simple-Mente is a show about every-day life problems that don't seem to be related to mental health but actually are, hosted by an adult and a teenager in order to get different perspectives.

*Speaking of Palestine (English), 1st Monday of each month, 4:00 pm - 5:00 pm This program provides news on the events affecting Palestine.

*Voces de Mujeres (Bilingual), Saturday 1:00 pm -2:00 pm

The program focuses on social, cultural, and political issues that women face today. Through a variety of interviews, the hosts Maria Mendoza, Maria de los Angeles, and Amalia Contardi present a cutting edge program with information and education from a female perspective. The public is encouraged to phone in with their comments.

*WCCS Focus on Peer Support (Spanish) Tuesday, 4-5pm

A program from West County Community Health Services that focuses on peer support, health, education and empowerment.

*Women's Spaces (English), Monday 11:00 am - 12:00 pm. Repeated Monday 11:00 pm - 12:00 am

This show is dedicated to and conducts interviews with ordinary women doing extraordinary things. Elaine first produced the show in 1978 on KBBF FM in Santa Rosa, the nation's first bilingual radio station, and it lasted until 1981. In 2007 Elaine and her partner Kenneth Norton resurrected the show for TV with her first TV broadcast on Santa Rosa Community station through Comcast Cable Access. In December 2011 she produced her 200th TV show. In September 2012 Elaine again began producing the Women's Spaces Radio Show on Radio KBBF-89.1 FM out of their Santa Rosa, CA studio.
