## SECTION II. RESPONSIVE PROGRAMS

The station has broadcast programming dealing with each of the above-referenced issues. Programming dealing with each issue is set out below.

A. Presidential Election:

"Crimson Conversations" –Broadcast on October 26<sup>th</sup>, 1 p.m.; Host Rich Robinson discusses the Presidential Election with the President of UA College Democrats and UA College Republicans. The Presidents from the UA College Democrats and UA College Republicans analyzed the Presidential and Vice Presidential debates and how it affected President Obama's and Governor Mitt Romney's poll ratings for the Presidential election.

B. Student Housing Options/ Dining Halls:

C. Fiscal Cliff:
