Children and Family Community Activities

During 2023 WUXP either participated or hosted the following community related events:

The Heritage Foundation 39th Annual "Main Street Festival"

Aired public service announcements and partnered with local The Heritage Foundation "Main Street Festival". Several joined the 39th anniversary of Main Street Festival (April 22 and 23), a beloved annual event in the historic downtown of Franklin, Tennessee. This festival is one of the top 20 events in the Southeast by the Southeast Tourism Society and attracts more than 100,000 visitors.
