Copper Country Today - Aired Weekly on Sunday at 7:00 am

March 31 - Host Todd VanDyke welcomed Dan Jamison from the Calumet Theatre and Andrew Ranville from the Keweenaw Outdoor Recreation Coalition, in advance of a joint fundraiser the two organizations are planning. Arts and Culture, Recreation, Service Agencies and Nonprofits, Cultural Heritage. Kyle Hubert, Ben Manchester and Leila Larson from the Houghton High School Robotics Team join host Todd VanDyke for a discussion about their activities. Education, Job Training.

March 24 - Visit Keweenaw Director Brad Barnett talked with host Todd VanDyke about the challenges faced by businesses following a disastrous winter tourism season, and a new effort to make more of the Keweenaw's attractions handicap accessible. Economy/Tourism, Recreation, Cultural Heritage.
