Newscast Overview and Quarterly Issues Addressed

WSGC Radio produces daily newscasts that air on a regularly scheduled basis.

WSGC airs expanded local news at 6:35 a.m.,7:05 a.m.,7:35 a.m.,8:05 a.m., and 12:05 p.m and 5:05 p.m. Monday through Saturday after two minutes of national and world news from Fox News.

Some of the issues covered in these local newscasts are as follows.

- 1. **Hospital to seek funds from County-News Treatment** -Elbert Memorial Hospital's Authority Board representatives appeared before the Elbert County Board of Commissioners at a work session to explain EMH's upcoming fiscal year budget, then in August the authority asked the commissioners for an increased millage rate to help offset the hospital's indigent care costs.
- Commission begins improvements on two fire stations-News Treatment- County Administrator Bob
 Thomas said the county will begin the groundwork on building two new fire stations at the Centerville Fire
 Station on
 - Hartwell Highway and at the Deep Creek Fire Station on Stinchcomb Road during the first week of October. The new fire stations will be the same design as more recently built fire stations, such as those located and recently completed on Athens Highway and Pearl Mill Road.
- 3. **Bowman City Council Approves request to seek Library Grant-News Treatment-**The Council applied for a \$300,000.00 state Grant to build a new library in the town.
- 4. Award winning author Karen Zacharias to be at Library-News Treatment / Community Service- Author Karen Zacharias led a program at the County Library. The Program was a writers workshop "Writing Your Memoirs: How do you get started? How do you build a story?"
