

KHKF-Issues and Programs- 2nd Quarter 2020

1. ISSUE: Man arrested after crash

GUEST: Oregon State Police

DESCRIPTION:

A Longview, Washington man was arrested in Baker County after a crash on Hwy 203 outside of Baker City. According to reports from Oregon State Police, deputies responded to reports of a crash and found 49-year-old Tyrone Thomas Pocan, the sole occupant of the vehicle. During the investigation the operator showed signs of impairment and was arrested for DUII and Unlawful Possession of a Weapon by a Felon. A consent search revealed drug paraphernalia and syringes with residue of an unknown substance. The vehicle was towed from the scene. Pocan provided a BAC of 0.00 and refused a DRE evaluation. Pocan subsequently provided urine and was cited and released from the jail for the crimes.

2. ISSUE: Wolf Depredation Grant

DESCRIPTION:

During the Union County Commissioner's meeting, the commissioner's was awarded \$9,330 from the Oregon Department of Agriculture for the 2020 Wolf Compensation program. The full amount of \$1,330 that was requested was received for the depredation loss and \$8,000 in prevention funds.

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife has released its annual wolf census for 2019. Most of the numbers showed an increasing number of wolves and packs. ODFW Statewide Communications Coordinator Michelle Dennehy said one important number went down.

"We saw a reduction in confirmed livestock depredations last year," she said. "We had 16 confirmed depredations compared to 28 the previous year."

Dennehy said ODFW is grateful to the hard work by livestock producers in the use of nonlethal methods of deterring wolves.

"They are required to use nonlethal action before we can take any kind of lethal action against wolves," she said. "We didn't last year."

ODFW is only allowed to take lethal action against packs in Eastern Oregon for a set number of depredations. Western Oregon wolves are monitored by the federal government.

3. ISSUE: Baker City man charged with Murder

BAKER CITY - 22-year-old Damion Colvin of Minot, North Dakota, a former resident of Baker County, was arrested this past week on charges related to a homicide in North Dakota.

According to reports released from the Minot Police Department, Colvin, and the victim, 21-year-old Jordan Andrew Parisean, Colvin's stepbrother, were in a physical altercation the lead to Colvin shooting Parisean, who died a short time later at an area hospital. Officers with the Minot Police Department took Colvin into custody and later charged him with murder. He is currently being held without bond at the Ward County Jail. WALLOWA COUNTY - Stephan Austin, 18 of Wallowa County was arrested by the Enterprise Police Department, recently for multiple Sexual counts on 2 thirteen old victims. 1 count of ONLINE SEXUAL CORRUPTION OF A CHILD II [Felony], 3 counts of ONLINE SEXUAL CORRUPTION OF A CHILD I [Felony], 1 count of CONTRIBUTING SEX TO THE DELINQUENCY OF A MINOR [Misdemeanor], 2 counts of SEXUAL ABUSE I (RAPE) [Felony], 1 count of SODOMY II [Felony], 1 count of UNLAWFUL SEXUAL PENETRATION II [Felony], 3 counts of SEXUAL MISCONDUCT (OTHER) [Misdemeanor], 2 counts of LURING A MINOR [Felony], and 2 counts of RAPE II [Felony]. Austin is currently in the Umatilla County Jail, bail set at \$308,750.
