1. **ISSUE: Shooting leads to arrest in Baker County**

GUEST: Baker County Sheriff's Office

DESCRIPTION:

An arrest has been made after a shooting incident in Baker County yesterday that sent one man to the hospital. According to the Baker County Sheriff's Office the incident took place near H Street in Baker City. Later in the day law enforcement determined that a late model Toyota pickup may have been involved in the incident. A coordinated effort among law enforcement from Malheur, Grant and Baker Counties led to the location of the vehicle in the Dooley Mountain area and the suspect 48-year-old Shawn Quentin Greenwood was taken into custody.

2. **ISSUE: Local student will join senators in D.C.**

The United State Senate Youth Program announced that High School students from around the state will be joining Senator Ron Wyden and Senator Jeff Merkley in representing Oregon in the nation's capital in March. Haiden Wiggins of Cove was selected from among the state's top student leaders of the 104 national student delegations who will receive a \$10,000 college scholarship for undergraduate study.

3. **ISSUE: Overdue snowmobiler located in Marble Creek Area**

DESCRIPTION:

Search and Rescue was called to the Marble Creek area in Baker County over the weekend after reports of an overdue snowmobiler. Kern Morrison of Baker City and Denis Apple were snowmobiling in the Marble Creek area when Morrison left in an attempt to reach the summit. When Morrison did not return for several hours, Apple called 911. Search and Rescue responded and located Morrison, whose snowmobile had become buried in over five feet of snow. After digging out the snowmobile, Morrison was able to travel down the mountain on his own.

4. **ISSUE: Grande Ronde Water Project**

GUEST: Union County Commissioner Donna Beverage

DESCRIPTION:

The continuation on the Upper Grande Ronde Place-Based Water project will be meeting this Wednesday. Union County Commissioner Donna Beverage explained on what the project is and a project that has been ongoing since 2016.

Beverage explained “We are doing a 20 to 50 year water plan, planning is funded by the Oregon Water resource Department. We are trying to bring in as many stakeholders together as we can to work on this project, and have been working on it for three years. We are at the stage where we have our top priorities and we want every voice heard. We understand what the needs are in Union County, too much water in the spring and not enough in late summer. This project will help alleviate this problem.”

Beverage went on and said that a lot of time we have too much water in the spring and not enough in late summer.

Commissioner Beverage said, ‘If you are interested in water please attend the meeting.’”

6. **ISSUE: Fatal Crash closed I-84 in Baker County**

I-84 was closed for a short time yesterday 4-miles west of Huntington due to a two vehicle crash. Preliminary investigation revealed that Pontiac Grand Am, occupied by Michael Maddox (55) of Weiser, Idaho, was parked on the eastbound shoulder of I-84 when an eastbound Ford Explorer, operated by Debra Archer (37) of Kelso, Washington, ran into the Pontiac. Maddox, who was seated in the driver's seat, sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased.
