FOX 17 broadcasts seven newscasts -- FOX 17 MORNING NEWS (4:30-9am Sunday through Saturday), FOX 17 NEWS AT ELEVEN (11am-noon Monday through Friday), FOX 17 NEWS AT FOUR (4-5pm Monday through Friday), FOX 17 NEWS AT FIVE (5-6pm Monday through Friday), FOX 17 NEWS AT SIX (6-7pm Monday through Friday), FOX 17 NEWS AT TEN (10-11pm Sunday through Saturday) and FOX 17 NEWS AT ELEVEN (11-11:30pm Sunday through Saturday) – plus one lifestyle program -- FOX 17 MORNING MIX (9-10am Monday through Friday).

WXMI has identified the following issues as significant to our viewers. The list includes issues most frequently covered for the Second Quarter of 2022: (1) Crime & Safety (2) Community Events (3) Education & Youth Issues (4) Economy and (5) Government & Politics (6) Health.

 FOX 17 is on the scene at Grand Rapids Federal Court as closing arguments wrap up and the case prepares to go to the jury next week in the trial for four Barry County militia members accused of masterminding a plot to kidnap Gov. Gretchen Whitmer, transport her to Wisconsin, put her on "trial" and then execute the governor.
- C. "New Police Dog" 04/04/22 6pm 2:01 A FOX 17 crew goes all the way to White Cloud for a story on the Newaygo County Sheriff's Department's newest deputy and his handler – a police dog named Si, a 2-year-old German shepherd from Slovakia that the department recently obtained from a specialty kennel down in Indiana.

MAY

A. **"Two Shooting Decisions"** 05/03/22 4pm 4:30 FOX provides live coverage of a press conference where the Kent County prosecutor presents his findings regarding two highly publicized cases from March -1) a traffic accident where a sheriff's deputy in training accidentally fired his gun twice, and 2) an attempted home invasion where the homeowner shot and killed a man trying to enter his residence.

- B. "Killer's Sentence Reduced" 05/09/22 5pm 2:29
 FOX 17 is on the scene at Calhoun County Circuit Court in Battle Creek where, as part of a plea agreement for showing investigators where the body had been buried, Derek Horton receives a reduced sentence of from 15 to 30 years in prison for killing his girlfriend 11 months before.
- C. "A Violent Weekend" 05/16/22 5pm 2:11 FOX 17 speaks with city officials and Grand Rapids Police after a particularly violent and deadly weekend, which saw multiple shootings including two people killed in incidents at two separate locations miles away from each other, but in areas where this sort of violent crime doesn't usually occur.

JUNE

"Mental-Health Training" 06/02/22 6pm 2:42 A day after a screaming man suffering a mental-health crisis grabbed a police officer's gun and shot him in the leg, a FOX 17 crew is at the Battle Creek Police Department speaking with supervisors and a sociology professor about training for officers when responding to mental-health calls.
- B. "A Rough 1st 90 Days" 06/03/22 5pm 3:37
 A FOX 17 crew sits down for an exclusive interview looking back on his first 90 days on the job with new Grand Rapids police chief Eric Winstrom, an officer for more than 20 years in Chicago who was greeted during his first month in West Michigan with a highly controversial case where a white officer shot a black man to death that has been the focus of national attention.

"Cop Charged with Murder" 06/10/22 10pm 5:30 In a story that has gone viral and garnered nationwide attention, FOX 17 has crews on the scene in both Grand Rapids District Court and at the Calhoun County Jail in Battle Creek where a white Grand Rapids police officer is arraigned on a second-degree murder charge for shooting a black man to death in April.

- A. **"Holland Bands Together"** 05/05/22 10pm 2:02 FOX 17 is on the scene in Holland, where community leaders and businesses have come together in a public show of support for Ukraine during Holland's busiest time of year – the annual Tulip Time Festival that attracts thousands -- by collecting bandages, diapers and other essential supplies that they've arranged to be distributed in the war-torn country.
- B. "Tulip Time" 05/08/22 10pm 2:28
 FOX 17 is on the scene in Holland for the first big weekend of the 2022 Tulip
 Time festival, which attracts thousands of people to the Lake Michigan shoreline
 community to see millions of tulips and is resuming its popular activities after
 time off for the coronavirus pandemic.
- C. "**River Bank Run**" 05/14/22 10pm 3:49 FOX 17 has crews presenting live reports and then covering the Amway River Bank Run in Grand Rapids, a qualifying race for the Boston Marathon that played host to 10,000 runners in various races that resumed after abbreviated versions were offered the past two years due to the coronavirus pandemic.

JUNE

- A. "Rosa Parks Circle Reopens" 06/01/22 5pm 1:51 FOX 17 is live on the scene in downtown Grand Rapids as the city removes the construction gates and fences and officially reopens one of its most popular gathering spots – Rosa Parks Circle – to the public after being closed for more than a year for more than \$3 million in renovations.
- B. "Arts Festivals Return" 06/03/22 5pm 6:10
 FOX 17 devotes two crews to covering two large arts festivals attracting thousands of visitors while resuming publicly for the first time in three years due to the coronavirus pandemic the 42nd Festival of the Arts in downtown Grand Rapids and the 71st Arts Fair in Kalamazoo.
- C. "**Big Golf Tourney Here**" 06/19/22 10pm 6:00 FOX 17 has two crews at the Meijer LPGA Classic at the Blythefield Country Club in Belmont during the day – one speaking with tournament officials about the hundreds of thousands of dollars donated and all the money poured back into

the community by the tourney, and the other documenting the final day of competition among the world's best women golfers.

3. EDUCATION & YOUTH ISSUES:

- A. "Excellence In Education" 04/05/22 5pm 2:33
 A FOX 17 crew goes to Muir in Ionia County to profile a first-grade teacher at Twin Rivers Elementary School who works 10 to 12 hours per day and has been honored as this week's statewide Excellence In Education winner by the Michigan Lottery.
- B. "College Enrollments Plunge" 04/06/22 6pm 2:20

people attending the annual Tulip Time celebration, which returns this year after a hiatus due to the coronavirus pandemic.

C. "**Muskegon No. 3 In U.S.**" 05/06/22 5pm 2:13 FOX 17 has a crew in Muskegon speaking with local real-estate and business experts after Fortune magazine announces that the Lake Michigan shoreline county of 173,000 ranks third in America when it comes to overpriced homes, saying that 59 percent of all of Muskegon County's homes are "overvalued."

"**Protests Disrupt Meeting**" 05/11/22 5pm 2:45 A FOX 17 crew speaks with city administrators and commissioners after the second straight Grand Rapids City Commission meeting was disrupted and then halted early by residents protesting the shooting death of Patrick Lyoya by a white Grand Rapids police officer, a story that has attracted national attention.

 FOX 17 is on the scene in Allendale after the FBI raids the home of Ryan Kelley and then arrests the Republican candidate for governor for his participation in the Jan. 6, 2021, insurrection and deadly rioting at the U.S. Capitol in Washington, D.C. FOX 17 video that later went viral and was used by CNN and other news sources around the world.
- C. "Governor Nixes Casino" 06/15/22 10pm 4:45
 FOX 17 has crews in both Lansing and Fruitport Township, after Gov. Gretchen Whitmer denies final approval for a \$200 million gambling casino scheduled to be built by the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians in southern Muskegon County, saying she was placed in an "impossible position" by the U.S. Department of the Interior.
