The Importance of African Culture and Music

Description: Afrostrings host Daniel Ebo presented a one hour special dedicated to playing music that featured artists from West Africa, East Africa, and South Africa. The music was accompanied by information about the artists and the countries they are from, providing listeners with diverse sounds and knowledge about other cultures.

This led to a discussion about how women are treated during legal battles and court settings.

Cannabis Incarceration and Safe Consumption of Marijuana

Description: Sydney Kott, host of Variety with Sydney, hosted special programming for April 20th. This included a discussion about cannabis incarceration in addition to providing information about the safe consumption of marijuana. For example, they advised listeners to not drive when they are under the influence of marijuana.

Racial Inequities Related to Cannabis and Safe Consumption of Marijuana

Description: Renaissance Alt host Haley Summerfield hosted special programming for April 20th. She informs listeners about the Party Safe Project created by the Rose Entertainment Group, while encouraging students to only consume marijuana if they are of age, take care of their peers, and party responsibly. Haley also reviews the racial inequities related to cannabis, such as how a majority of Michigan dispensaries are owned by white citizens while there is a high rate of people of color incarcerated for cannabis. Summerfield reminded listeners that it is a privilege to be able to choose whether or not to consume cannabis on April 20th and that some people celebrate by not smoking.

Continuing the Conversation About Cannabis Incarceration and Information on the Recent Spike in Fentanyl-Related Overdoses in Kalamazoo, Michigan
