But a coalition of faith groups, including an order of Catholic nuns called Little Sisters of the Poor, says the law still violates their religious freedom. Other faith-based groups support the mandate as a matter of justice, saying all employees should have access to contraception. Tim O'Brien reports on the issues at stake.
