A HAM radio operator who now lives in Beverly Hills, Florida made contact with another radio hobbyist in Baltimore, Maryland. The magnet seems to have several layers and wires weaving throughout. The heel of the boot contains a plug. A Florida art curator purchased a mysterious work of art at an online auction: a tiny ceramic chip with six images. The seller told him the tiny images were the works of several prominent artists, including Andy Warhol and Claes Oldenburg. He went on to say that they made this chip as a miniature art museum to attach to the Apollo 12 lunar module launched in November 1969. Did NASA actually deliver the artwork of Andy Warhol to the moon? History Detectives tracks down three eyewitnesses to this historic moment.
