DIALOGUE MINNESOTA PROGRAMS IN THE 3<sup>rd</sup> QTR 2023 (A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, K, L, M, N) WDSM airs the 30-minute public affairs program Dialogue Minnesota hosted by Jim Du Bois every Sunday morning covering a wide variety of subjects important to Minnesotans.

The Assassination of St. Paul Police Patrolman James Sackett: Shortly after midnight on May 22, 1970, St. Paul Police Officer James Sackett and his partner responded to a call to transport a woman in labor to the hospital. When the officers arrived at the scene, Sackett was killed by a gunshot fired by a sniper. The incident capped a period of long-simmering tensions between the city's African-American community and the police. It took more than 30 years to bring the men responsible for the shooting to justice. Journalist William Swanson, author of the book Black, White, Blue: The Assassination of Patrolman Sackett, discusses the events leading up to the shooting and the eventual convictions of the perpetrators.

Deep Brain Stimulation: A miniature probe carefully inserted deep into the human brain is helping researchers treat several debilitating neurological conditions. Deep Brain Stimulation, or DBS, is a surgical procedure where a small device, precisely implanted, produces electrical impulses that alter the brain's electrical circuitry. DBS treats several neurological conditions, including epilepsy, chronic pain, and depression. At the University of Minnesota, the neurology department uses DBS to treat Parkinson's Disease. The procedure provides relief to patients suffering the symptoms of Parkinson's, such as tremors and dystonia. For many of these patients, DBS is more effective than medications. Dr. Gerald Vitek, the head of the U's neurology department and director of the neuromodulation research program, and Dr. Michael

Park, an assistant professor in the Department of Neurosurgery at the U, discuss the DBS procedure.

July 16, 2023

Improving Pediatric Oral Health: Many young children from low-income families lack access to dental care. Caregivers often seek temporary and expensive treatment in hospital emergency rooms when oral health issues arise. There is a simple, low-cost procedure that prevents cavities in children. Dr. Elise Sarvas, dental director of the Minnesota Oral Health Project, and Dr. Amos Deinard, University of Minnesota pediatrician, discuss the benefits of applying fluoride varnish to children's teeth.

July 23, 2023

Why Do People Believe "Fake News"?: A look at so-called "fake news," much of which is spread on social media. While we generally assume that we can separate fact from fiction, psychological research suggests otherwise. University of Minnesota Professor of English Andrew Elfenbein discusses his book The Gist of Reading and how written content can distort our perception of reality.

July 30, 2023

Remembering the "Minnesota Miracle": Fifty years ago, then-DFL Governor Wendell Anderson worked with the Conservative-controlled Legislature to pass fiscal policies that transformed the state's educational system. Though the process required the most extended special session in the state's history, the bipartisan effort and the commitment to economic and social equality became known as the "Minnesota Miracle." Minneapolis attorney and former state legislator Tom Berg, the author of the book Minnesota's Miracle: Learning From the Government That Worked, examines the legacy of Governor Anderson, what made the "Minnesota Miracle" possible, and what has happened to the "miracle" in the ensuing decades.

August 6, 2023,

Preserving Soil Health and Water Quality: Most crops in Minnesota are annuals, meaning they must be planted in the spring of each growing season and harvested in the fall. This leaves the soil bare during the late fall, winter, and early spring, exposing the soil to erosion and allowing fertilizer to run off into nearby water sources. The University of Minnesota is developing and

improving crops that can keep the soil covered all year and are grown with traditional field crops such as corn and soybeans. U of M Professor of Agronomy and Plant Genetics Nicolas Jordan discusses the Forever Green Initiative and how it will benefit the agricultural industry and enhance environmental quality.

August 13, 2023

Promoting Diversity in STEM Education: Women and people of color are historically underrepresented in the sciences, technology, engineering, and math, the so-called STEM professions. A University of Minnesota partnership with a St. Paul middle school aims to help address this disparity. Two U of M professors and a group of undergraduates are mentoring students at St. Paul's Murray Middle School. Associate Professor of Psychology Cheryl Olman and Associate Professor of Educational Psychology/Associate Vice Provost for Equity and Diversity Keisha Varma discuss the program.

August 20, 2023

Apple Breeding at the University of Minnesota: Fall is apple harvest time in Minnesota. The U of M has developed several varieties of apples over the years, including the Honeycrisp and Sweet Tango. Apple breeding research is underway at the U's Horticultural Research Center at its Landscape Arboretum in the Twin Cities. Senior Research Fellow David Bedford was part of the team that developed the Honeycrisp and discusses the process of breeding apples and the new varieties currently being developed at the U of M.

August 27, 2023

Aquatic Invasive Species: Among Minnesota's most valued resources are its lakes, rivers, and streams. But those waters are increasingly threatened by aquatic invasive species, living things not native to our state. Marine invasive species include fishes, plants, invertebrates, and microbes that can harm our health, environment, and economy. University of Minnesota Aquatic Invasive Species Center Extension Educator Megan Weber discusses a program offered through the center that trains citizen scientists to monitor invasive species and provides researchers with valuable data to help prevent the spread of these harmful plants and animals. September 3, 2023

Minnesota's Immigrants and Refugees: The influx of migrants and refugees in Minnesota is

driving dramatic demographic shifts. Minnesota is home to the second-largest Hmong population and the largest Somali population in the U.S. Since 1990, the state's Latino population has tripled. The Minneapolis-based Advocates for Human Rights is tracking these demographic trends and works to improve the lives of Minnesota's immigrants. The organization's Michelle Garnet Mackenzie and Robin Phillips discuss the challenges migrants and refugees face.

**September 10, 2023** 

The Politics of Care: More than 13 years after it was signed into law, the Affordable Care Act continues to generate controversy. It has survived several legal challenges and attempts by some members of Congress to repeal it. The Affordable Care Act debate raises a much broader question: how should a society care for its people and who is responsible for providing that care? University of Minnesota Political Science Professor Joan Tronto discusses her book Caring Democracy, which explores the politics of health care and suggests that Americans are facing a care deficit.

**September 17, 2023** 

The Rational Animal: Many of us believe we occasionally act irrationally when spending money. But often, risk has its rewards. University of Minnesota Carlson School of Management Professor Vladas Griskavigis explores evolution's role in our economic decision-making and how seemingly irrational choices can be rooted in purposeful evolutionary traits. Professor Griskavigis discusses his book The Rational Animal: How Evolution Made Us Smarter Than We Think.

**September 24, 2023** 

Deep Winter Greenhouses: The University of Minnesota Extension Program is developing Deep Winter Greenhouses (DWGs) in the state to research how small-scale farmers can grow crops year-round. The DWGs use solar energy to limit the amount of fossil fuels usually required to grow crops in northern winter climates. Extension researchers Greg Schweizer and Dan Handeen discuss the program.
