# April 2, 2023

Environmentally Friendly Farming: Agriculture plays a crucial role in protecting Minnesota's lakes, rivers, and streams. The University of Minnesota's Forever Green Initiative is tasked with developing new crops that are profitable for farmers and help maintain water quality. This week on Dialogue Minnesota, University of Minnesota Professor of Agronomy and Plant Genetics Nicolas Jordan discusses the Forever Green initiative and how it will benefit the agricultural industry while protecting the environment.

#### April 9, 2023

Promoting Diversity in STEM Education: Women and people of color are historically underrepresented in the sciences, technology, engineering, and math, the so-called STEM professions. A University of Minnesota partnership with a St. Paul Middle School aims to help address that disparity. Two U of M professors and a group of undergraduates are mentoring students at St. Paul's Murray Middle School. Associate Professor of Psychology Cheryl Olman and Associate Professor of Educational Psychology/Associate Vice Provost for Equity and Diversity Keisha Varma discuss the program.

## April 16, 2023

Does The Death Penalty Bring Justice or Closure to Murder Victims' Families?: Under the Trump administration, federal executions spiked while death sentences and executions at the state level fell to historic lows. And while most Americans still approve of the death penalty, fewer do now than did in 1972, according to a recent Gallup Poll. Other surveys show a similar trend. One of the main arguments supporting the death penalty is that it offers justice and closure for victims' families. University of Minnesota Professor of Social Work Mark Umbreit, who is also the founding Director of the Center for Restorative Justice and Peacemaking at the U, joins us to discuss a study that he and a Texas University colleague conducted that compared the impact of the death penalty on murder victim's families in Minnesota and Texas. The results question the belief that the death penalty provides the sense of justice and closure that most murder victims' families and friends seek.

#### April 23, 2023

Invisible Systems of Design: When we think of design, we tend to think of the things we can see. We think in terms of aesthetics and beauty. We see architecture, furniture, clothing, or webpage layout. But design affects much more than the visual world. Design systems from education to infrastructure to public health and politics dictate how society functions...or fails to function. The invisible systems of design are what Thomas Fisher hopes to reveal in his book Designing Our Way to A Better World. This week, a conversation with the former dean of the University of Minnesota's College of Design and the current director of the Metropolitan Design Center, who discusses his book and how, by understanding the inner workings of design, we can begin to build better and more resilient systems to respond to a rapidly changing 21st Century.

## April 30, 2023

Fishing In Minnesota: Minnesota's walleye fishing opener is May 13. Fishing is a favorite pastime for many of us, and local travelers and visitor bureaus work hard to reel in anglers. Concordia University (St. Paul) Associate Professor of English and Journalism Eric Dregni, the author of Let's Go Fishing: Fish Tales From the North, discusses the unique role that fishing plays in Minnesota's culture.

#### May 7, 2023

Aquatic Invasive Species: Among Minnesota's most valued resources are our lakes, rivers, and streams. But those waters are increasingly threatened by aquatic invasive species...living things that are not native to our state. Marine invasive species include fishes, plants, invertebrates, and microbes that can harm our health, environment, and economy. University of Minnesota Aquatic Invasive Species Center Extension Educator Megan Weber discusses a program offered through the Center that trains citizen scientists to monitor invasive species and provides researchers with valuable data to help prevent the spread of these harmful animals and plants. How Fear Distorts Reality: Over 70 years ago, Russia detonated its first atomic bomb, thrusting America into a state of anxiety. The collapse of the Soviet Union brought an end to the Cold War, but our unease persisted. University of Minnesota History Professor Elaine Tyler May discusses the origins of American fear and its detrimental impact on our society. She is the author of Fortress America: How We Embraced Fear and Abandoned Democracy.

#### May 21, 2023

The May 6, 1965 Tornadoes: During the evening of May 6, 1965, a series of tornadoes struck the Twin Cities area, killing 14, injuring hundreds, and causing \$51 million in damage. Despite the destruction, the death toll could have been far worse. Officials credited the decision to activate the Civil Defense sirens and continuous radio coverage with perhaps saving hundreds of lives. Minnesota Department of Natural Resources Senior Climatologist Kenny Blumenfeld discusses this historic tornado outbreak.

### May 28, 2023

The Civil Rights Movement in 1968: 1968 marked a pivotal year in America's Civil Rights Movement. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated. The Black Power Movement gained momentum. President Lyndon Baines Johnson, a champion of civil rights, announced that he would not seek a second term. University of Minnesota Professor of African American and African Studies Keith Mayes discusses the year's significance in the ongoing struggle for racial justice.

## June 4, 2023

The University of Minnesota's Public Life Project: America is a deeply divided nation. These political and social divisions are evident on college campuses as they are elsewhere in the country. The University of Minnesota College of Liberal Arts launched the Public Life Project in the fall of 2021 to help address these divisions and encourage respectful conversations about controversial issues. The director of the Public Life Project, U of M Sociology Professor Douglas Hartmann, tells us how the initiative is working two years after its inception.

## June 11, 2023

The Tretter Collection of LGBTQ+ History: June is Pride Month, and the University of Minnesota Andersen Library houses the Jean-Nickolas Tretter Collection, which documents the history of the state's LGBTQ+ community. In 2015, the Tretter Transgender Oral History Project was launched with the goal of documenting the lived experience of transgender and non-gender conforming people in the Midwest. Project Director Andrea Jenkins discusses the Oral History Project and the larger Tretter Collection.

#### June 18, 2023

Saving Our Pollinators: Scientists are expressing concern about the declining numbers of pollinating insects such as bees and butterflies. Urbanization, the loss of prairie land, and the use of pesticides have all contributed to the problem. University of Minnesota Professor of Entomology Vera Krischik discusses actions that landowners and homeowners can take to make their properties more pollinator friendly.

Resiliency In Children: Minnesota's K-12 students who come from disadvantaged backgrounds

or underrepresented communities often significantly underperform their peers academically

and on standardized tests. Yet, some students manage to overcome adversity and succeed in

the classroom. University of Minnesota Regents Professor and Distinguished McKnight

Professor of Child Development Ann Masten is an expert on resiliency in children and shares

her insights on why some children are more resilient than their peers who come from similar

social and economic circumstances.
