Section I – Issues

KARS-FM provides its listeners with programming that addresses issues of concern within the Northern Colorado community. The following issues were identified by this station as significant issues facing our community in the first quarter of 2023.

• Veterans:

According to the Census Bureau, 371,081 veterans live in Colorado and over a thousand are homeless and don't know how to receive help for the mental and physical challenges they face.

Animal Welfare

According to the American Veterinary Medical Association, about 53 percent of Colorado households don't have any pets and the number of shelter pet adoptions are down 8.9 percent in Colorado.

Poverty & Family Support

The Census Bureau states that 17 percent of people living in Fort Collins have below-poverty-level incomes and about 9.7 percent of families are suffering from poverty. Community Food Share and the state of Colorado state, that more than 566,000 people are food insecure, 147,120 of them are children and 73,000 of these children don't have health care.

Public Health and Safety

The Red Cross says that every 2 seconds, someone in the US needs blood and according to a recent blood drive, Larimer County's supply is waning.

The state of Colorado says about half the homes in the state have radon levels higher than the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's recommended action and these levels, along with air pollution from wildfires, are putting our homes and schools at risk.

The CDC states, 864,454 adults in Colorado have a disability and 3% of those disabilities are vision-related

According to Safe Kids Worldwide, every five days a child nineteen and under is killed in a collision with a train, and for every death, three more children suffer severe injuries
