Quarterly Issues / Programs List

KGLN provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the previous calendar quarter were:

- **Public Safety:** Grand Junction Fire Department continues efforts to train the Grand Valley to save lives through Hands Only CPR. At least 2,000 people trained to date. Montrose School District making a proactive security move, hiring a full time security specialist.
- **Environment:** Colorado in the midst of a significant drought. Forecasters are calling for an El Nino weather pattern which could have a measurable impact with heavy winter snow.
- **Health Care:** Issues include the Affordable Care Act and its future especially in rural Colorado. And Grand Junction's second largest hospital, Community Hospital, has entered the first step of being being purchased by Centura Health, the largest health care system in the state.
- **Mental Health:** As more light is shed on mental health, the community is stepping up in many ways, including grief support for pet owners. The Roice-Hurst Humane Society starting such a group saying the loss of a pet can have significant impact on emotional health.
- **Transportation:** Grand Junction Chamber of Commerce and local businesses and manufacturers are working together to establish a transloading facility to make rail shipping available and avoid expensive trucking between Grand Junction and Denver and Salt Lake City.
